SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 14 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 16 PROVISION. Upon certification by the Director of the Department of Higher 17 Education that transfers are needed to make maximum utilization of funds and 18 appropriations provided for financial aid programs, and with the approval of 19 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and a review by the Arkansas Legislative Council, funds and appropriations may be transferred between 20 21 financial aid programs, except that funds and appropriations may not be 22 transferred for such purposes from either the Governor's Scholars Program or 23 the Academic Challenge Scholarships Program in excess of \$1,000,000 in the 24 aggregate in either fiscal year. Any transfer restrictions contained in 25 appropriation acts for the Department of Higher Education relating to 26 appropriation transfers from Governor's Scholars Program and Academic 27 Challenge Scholarships shall not be applicable to transfers between 28 Governor's Scholars and Academic Challenge Scholarship appropriations. 29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001

July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005.

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SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. In order to provide timely payments under financial aid appropriations made in this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is authorized to provide loans from the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund to make available all funds

1 attributable to the financial aid programs under the then current official 2 revenue estimates. In the event of an unanticipated state revenue shortfall, 3 any such loans remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall be repaid from 4 revenues distributed in the first two months of the next fiscal year. Funds for appropriations made in this Act for purposes other than financial aid 5 6 shall not be affected by the application of this provision. 7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001 8 July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005. 9 SECTION 16.
