22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
23

24 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - GENERAL OPERATIONS. There is hereby
25 established for the Department of Higher Education - General Operations for
26 the 2003-2005 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees
27 whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform
28 Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or
29 its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any
30 position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in
31 dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification
32 and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are
33 hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and
34 Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

15 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
 17 PROVISION. Upon certification by the Director of the Department of Higher
 18 Education that transfers are needed to make maximum utilization of funds and
 19 appropriations provided for financial aid programs, and with the approval of
 20 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and a review by the Arkansas
 21 Legislative Council, funds and appropriations may be transferred between
 22 financial aid programs, except that funds and appropriations may not be

13 FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made
14 available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out
15 in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2), such documents as may be necessary shall be
16 processed so that funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000
17 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account from which the
18 technical college draws its general revenue support. Such funds as may be
19 transferred shall not exceed ~~74.45%~~ 77.19% of the total funds available from
20 the Work Force 2000 Development Fund during each fiscal year of the biennial
21 period ending ~~June 30, 2003~~ June 30, 2005.

22 Arkansas College Savings General Obligation Bonds Program to ensure that
23 funds are allocated and expended in a manner consistent with the provisions
24 of the Internal Revenue Code applicable to the Arkansas College Savings
25 General Obligation Bond Program (Program). The funds reappropriated for the
26 development of projects at State Institutions of Higher Education and the
27 payment of project costs and expenses of the issuance of the bonds of the
28 Arkansas College Savings General Obligation Bonds Program shall be allocated
29 and expended pursuant to the provisions of Arkansas Code 6-62-701 et. seq.
30 and other laws of this State. The expenditure and allocation of funds shall
31 be exempt from any other provisions of state law which conflicts with any
32 provision of the rules and regulations which rules and regulations are
33 required to ensure the compliance of the Program with the applicable
34 provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from ~~July 1, 2001~~

2 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

4 SAVINGS BONDS LIMITATIONS. The total principal amount of bonds to be issued
5 during any fiscal biennium shall not exceed three-hundred million dollars
6 (\$300,000,000), nor shall the principal amount of bonds outstanding at any
7 time have debt service requirements in excess of twenty-four million dollars
8 (\$24,000,000) in any one fiscal year from all sources.

16 the State, surplus funds and appropriations may be transferred between the
17 appropriations provided for "Health Education Grants" by this Act by the
18 ~~Eighty-Third~~ Eighty-Fourth General Assembly for Dental Aid, Optometry Aid,
19 Veterinary Aid, Podiatry Aid, Chiropractic Aid and Osteopathic Aid.

23 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

25 FORWARD - HEALTH EDUCATION GRANTS. The balance of the funds and
26 appropriations as provided for "Health Education Grants" in this Act which
27 remain on ~~June 30, 2002~~ June 30, 2004, shall be carried forward and made
28 available for the same purposes for the fiscal year ending ~~June 30, 2003~~ June
29 30, 2005.

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from ~~July 1, 2001~~

33 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REPORTING
35 REQUIREMENTS - HEALTH EDUCATION GRANTS. The Arkansas Department of Higher
36 Education shall annually compile information, as described herein, on

1 students who receive financial aid through the appropriations for health
2 education grants provided for in this Act. Such information shall include
3 the number of students receiving financial aid under each line item of the
4 appropriation made for "Health Education Grants" in this Act, the name of
5 each out-of-state school which each student is attending or has attended,
6 and, if available, the location and occupation of each student who has
7 completed the course of study for a period of three years following
8 completion.

9 Such information shall be compiled into a report and presented in
10 conjunction with the biennial appropriation budget request for the
11 appropriation provided herein, to the Arkansas Legislative Council.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from ~~July 1, 2001~~

15 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

17 EDUCATION GRANTS - PRIORITIES. The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating
18 Board, after consulting with the recognized associations of each of the
19 applicable medical professions and other interested persons, shall determine
20 the priorities for the applicable programs enumerated in the appropriation
21 made for "Health Education Grants" in this Act. The Arkansas Department of
22 Higher Education, if necessary, shall re-adjust the number of ~~freshman~~
23 positions for entering students to be funded for each applicable program
24 based upon the priorities determined by the board.

25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from ~~July 1, 2001~~

28 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

30 EDUCATION GRANTS - STUDY. The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board
31 shall conduct a study during the ~~2001-2003~~ 2003-2005 biennium as to the
32 future need for health care providers in dentistry, veterinary medicine,
33 chiropractic, optometry, osteopathy and podiatry in Arkansas and shall report
34 its findings to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee on or

5 AID PROGRAMS REPORTING. The Arkansas Department of Higher Education shall
6 report by May 30 to the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education the
7 budgeted allocation for each financial aid program funded through the Higher
8 Education Grants Fund Account for the upcoming fiscal year and projections
9 for the following year.

10
11 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
13 AUDIT/REVIEW OF STATE SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS. Any post-secondary institution that
14 receives state scholarship funds administered by the Arkansas Department of
15 Higher Education shall be subject to audit/review of such funds by the
16 Division of Legislative Audit, upon approval of the Legislative Joint Audit
17 Committee.

18
19 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AUDIT
21 DATA. All post-secondary institutions shall provide to the Arkansas
22 Department of Higher Education a copy of the Integrated Post-Secondary
23 Education Data System (IPEDS) which shall be subject to audit by the Arkansas
24 Department of Higher Education ~~fiscal personnel~~.

25
26 SECTION 33. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
28 APPROPRIATION TRANSFER PROCEDURES - AR GEOGRAPHICAL CRITICAL NEEDS MINORITY
29 TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM. The Director of the Arkansas Department of
30 Higher Education shall determine the amount available, up to \$200,000 per
31 fiscal year, to fund the Arkansas Geographical Critical Needs Minority
32 Teacher Scholarships and shall certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
33 State and the State Treasurer such amount as is required to be transferred
34 from the Higher Education Grants Fund Account. Upon receiving such
35 certification, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the State Treasurer
36 shall cause to be transferred the necessary funds and appropriation to the

1 fund account of the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff for implementation
2 of this program. The University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff may use up to
3 twenty percent (20%) of the funds and appropriation for administration of the
4 program.

5
6 SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING
8 FOR SALARY INCREASES. New funding through the Revenue Stabilization Act
9 determined by the Arkansas Department of Higher Education to have been for
10 salary increases for each year of the 2003-2005 Biennium for Institutions of
11 Higher Education shall be used exclusively for salary increases. New funding
12 actually received for salary increases shall be spent exclusively for salary
13 increases based upon the state general revenue portion of total unrestricted
14 educational and general revenue. Funding received under this provision shall
15 be used for no purpose other than to provide such salary increases. Any
16 designated funds not used for salary increases shall be recouped at the end
17 of each fiscal year and transferred to the General Revenue Allotment Reserve
18 Fund.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
20 through June 30, 2005.

21
22 SECTION 35. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
23 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
24 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
25 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
26 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
27 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
28 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
29 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
30 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

31
32 SECTION 36. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
33 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
34 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
35 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
36 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by

1 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
2 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
3 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

4
5 SECTION 37. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
6 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
7 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
8 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of
9 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
10 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
11 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
12 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
13 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
14 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
15 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
