28	SECTION 1. Purpo	ose. The purpose of this act is to	establish the lead
29	agency and its authori	ty over the Arkansas Police Corps Pr	rogram, a federally
30	funded scholarship prog	gram designed to employ college-educ	cated police
31	officers in local and	state law enforcement agencies and t	to foster the
32	development and growth	of community policing efforts through	ighout Arkansas.

34	SECTION 2. Admin	nistration of the Arkansas Police Co	orps Program.
35	(a) The Departme	ent of Criminal Justice at the Unive	ersity of Arkansas
36	at Little Rock is desig	gnated as the state lead agency resp	oonsible for

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implementing any federal scholarships or training programs that fall under

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2	the umbrella of the Police Corps Act, Title XX, Subtitle A of the Violent
3	Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994, 42 U.S.C. § 14091-14102, and
4	all subsequent and related federal legislation.
5	(b) The department may promulgate rules and regulations necessary for
6	the administration and operation of any such programs in the State of
7	Arkansas, including the creation of the Police Corps Advisory Group which
8	<u>shall:</u>
9	(1) Serve as the body to review policies imposed by the federal
10	government and the rules and regulations developed by the department for the
11	Arkansas Police Corps Program;
12	(2) Serve as the selection committee for Arkansas Police Corps
13	Program participants;
14	(3) Serve as the body to establish eligibility requirements for
15	the Arkansas Police Corps Program, within the parameters set by the federal
16	<pre>government;</pre>
17	(4) Serve as the body to establish the participant removal
18	procedures for the Arkansas Police Corps Program;
19	(5) Serve as the appeals committee for the Arkansas Police Corps
20	Program, should a training participant be removed for any reason; and
21	(6) Perform all other duties as needed.
22	(c) The chairperson of the department, who serves as the Director of
23	the Arkansas Police Corps Program, or the director's designee shall serve as
24	an ex officio member and as chair of the advisory group.
25	(d) Neither the director nor the director's designee shall sit on any
26	appeals panel in cases involving removal of participants from the program.
27	(3) The advisory group shall meet at the call of the chair.
28	
29	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
30	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that it is necessary to designate a
31	lead agency for purposes of obtaining federally funded scholarships under the
32	Arkansas Police Corps Program; that this act establishes the lead agency; and
33	that this act should go into effect immediately in order to be eligible for
34	the federal funds as soon as possible. Therefore, an emergency is declared
35	to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
36	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

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1	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
2	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
3	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
4	bill; or
5	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
6	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
