23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE	GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKAN	SAS:

25	SECTION 1. (a) The purpose of this section is to pr	omote uniformity
26	in the regulation of	ground transportation services in coun	_
27	population of at lea	st two hundred fifty thousand (250,000)	persons.
28	(b) The follow	wing definitions shall apply to any mun	icipal ordinance
29	regulating ground tr	ansportation services in a county havin	g a population of
30	at least two hundred	fifty thousand (250,000) persons, acco	rding to the most
31	recent decennial cen	sus:	
32	(1)(A)	"Airport shuttle vehicle" means a motor	vehicle with a
33	seating capacity min	imum of eight (8) and a maximum of no m	ore than fifteen
34	(15) passengers, inc	luding the driver.	
35	<u>(B</u>) "Airport shuttle vehicle" shall not	include an
36	executive sedan.		

1	(c) The venicle shall prominently display "Shuttle
2	Service" on the front or rear sides of the vehicle. This marking may be
3	permanent or temporary;
4	(2) "Airport terminal service" means the provision of public
5	transportation service operated for the purpose of transporting passengers
6	exclusively to and from a national airport terminal building and adjacent
7	parking facilities;
8	(3) "Black car" has the same meaning as executive sedan;
9	(4) "Courtesy vehicle" means any motor vehicle operating upon
10	the public streets of the city and that is owned or leased by a public or
11	private entity and operated exclusively to provide transportation services to
12	patrons to and from the entity's place of business without charge or other
13	consideration;
14	(5)(A) "Demand-response service" means the provision of a "for-
15	hire" vehicle, permitted by the city, responding to a call by a passenger for
16	a ride to a destination, or, alternatively, a passenger being picked-up by a
17	"for-hire" vehicle parked in a visible location where potential passengers
18	are expected to congregate, excluding a national airport.
19	(B) "Demand-response service" is a response to any call
20	that has not been pre-scheduled at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of
21	the pick-up time;
22	(6) "Taxicab driver" means a person licensed by the state who
23	has registered as a taxicab driver with the city and has obtained a taxicab
24	driver's permit as required by the city, and who has been permitted to drive
25	a taxicab by an operator, or has entered into a written agreement for use of
26	a taxicab with an operator;
27	(7) "Exclusive ride" means a ride in which the passenger
28	engaging the taxicab restricts the ride solely to the passenger, or the
29	passenger's party, and the fare is charged at the ceiling rate;
30	(8)(A) "Executive sedan" means a taxicab that is:
31	(i) A sedan-type motor vehicle equipped with a
32	taximeter and having a seating capacity not in excess of six (6) passengers
33	including the driver;
34	(ii) Used for the transportation of persons for
35	hire;
36	(iii) Recognized by the automobile industry as a

1	<pre>luxury vehicle;</pre>
2	(iv) Operated at premium taxicab meter rates; and
3	(v) A vehicle that is two (2) model years old or
4	newer when initially inspected by the city or its designee to be placed into
5	service.
6	(B) Executive sedan, black car, livery vehicle, or premium
7	taxicab shall be deemed to be demand-response service vehicles;
8	(9) "Fleet taxicab operator" means a person operating two (2) or
9	more taxicabs, executive sedans, black cars, livery vehicles, or premium
10	taxicabs;
11	(10) "Independent taxicab operator" means any person permitted
12	by the city to operate a single taxicab;
13	(11) "Livery vehicle" has the same meaning as executive sedan;
14	(12) "Luxury limousine" means any of the following unmarked,
15	large, and luxurious passenger vehicles driven by a chauffeur and being of a
16	class and condition commonly associated with luxury markets:
17	(A) A luxury sedan-type motor vehicle that:
18	(i) Has a wheelbase of not less than one hundred
19	twenty-five (125) inches and having a partition between the driver and
20	passenger compartment; and
21	(ii) Is two (2) model years old or newer when
22	initially inspected by the city or its designee to be placed into service; or
23	(B) A customized luxury full size van-type motor vehicle
24	that:
25	(i) Has a wheelbase of not less than one hundred
26	twenty-five (125) inches, luxury interior, and luxury seating for seven (7)
27	or more passengers including the driver;
28	(ii) Is two (2) model years old or newer when
29	initially inspected by the city or its designee to be placed into service;
30	(13) "Manifest" means a daily record prepared by the taxicab
31	operator of all trips made by each taxicab showing the time and place of
32	origin of a call, time the call was dispatched, and to what driver, and when
33	possible, the address at which the passenger was dropped off;
34	(14) "Operator" means the holder of a valid permit for the
35	operation of taxicabs, black cars, executive sedans, livery vehicles or
36	premium taxicabs in the city;

1	(15) "Passenger-for-hire" means a person who engages a ride in a
2	taxicab, or other "for-hire" vehicle;
3	(16) "Permittee" means the person, firm or corporation holding
4	the operator or driver permit issued by the city;
5	(17) "Person" means an individual, firm, partnership,
6	association, joint venture, organization, and bodies politic and corporate,
7	or any combination thereof;
8	(18) "Premium taxicab" has the same meaning as executive sedan;
9	(19) "Public transit system" means a passenger transportation
10	service operated for the general public at a prescribed fare along
11	established routes on a fixed schedule, and other special routes and services
12	as may be deemed necessary;
13	(20) "Rate card" means a card approved by the city to be
14	displayed in each taxicab reflecting the rates of fare in force;
15	(21) "Scheduled medical transport vehicle" means any motor
16	vehicle:
17	(A) Operated exclusively by its owner, or employee of the
18	owner, as a passenger carrier "for-hire" over the public streets of the city
19	other than a public transit bus, taxicab, executive sedan, black car, livery
20	vehicle, premium taxicab, luxury limousine, paratransit vehicle, courtesy
21	vehicle, airport shuttle, or airport transit service;
22	(B) Designed for seven (7) passengers or more, including
23	the driver; and
24	(C) Clearly marked with the company name, address,
25	telephone number, and type of service provided;
26	(22) "Special paratransit vehicle" means any motor vehicle:
27	(A) Operated exclusively by its owner, or employee of the
28	owner, as a passenger carrier "for-hire" over the public streets of the city,
29	other than a public transit bus, taxicab, luxury limousine, courtesy vehicle,
30	airport shuttle, or scheduled medical transport vehicle;
31	(B) Designed for seven (7) passengers or more, including
32	the driver, except when the vehicle has been modified to meet the
33	accessibility standards of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; and
34	(C) Clearly marked with the company name, address,
35	telephone number, and type of service provided;
36	(23) "Specialized transportation service" means any

T	transportation of passengers upon the public streets of the city by motor
2	vehicle;
3	(24) "Specialty transportation" means the transportation of
4	passengers "for-hire" upon the public streets of the city by any vehicle
5	which is drawn by horse, mule or other animal, or any other novelty-type
6	vehicle which is not otherwise defined by this section;
7	(25) "Taxi zone" means that curb space along the public streets
8	of the city designated for the exclusive parking of taxicabs by the proper
9	placement of signs or markers reading "No Parking, Taxi Zone";
10	(26)(A) "Taxicab" means motor vehicles clearly marked as such,
11	equipped with a taximeter and having a seating capacity not in excess of
12	seven (7) passengers and used for the transportation of persons "for-hire".
13	(B) A Taxicab shall be five (5) model years old or newer
14	when initially inspected by the city or its designee to be placed into
15	service.
16	(C) "Taxicab" shall not include a vehicle having a seating
17	capacity in excess of seven (7) passengers and employed in transporting
18	persons over regular routes having fixed terminals or upon regular schedules
19	of operation.
20	(D) "Taxicab" may include motor vehicles designed for
21	fifteen (15) passengers or less, including the driver, which have been
22	modified to meet the accessibility requirements and standards of the
23	Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. However, the vehicle so modified
24	shall not have a seating capacity in excess of seven (7) passengers.
25	(E) "Taxicab" includes black cars, executive sedans,
26	livery vehicles and premium taxicabs; and
27	(27) "Taxicab service" means a passenger transportation service
28	operated in a vehicle permitted by the city and not operating on a fixed
29	route.
