The 5 Department shall either expend or have committed for expenditure the monies 6 allocated for the Quiz Bowl, Odyssey of the Mind, Destination Imagination, 7 and the State History Day Competition as authorized herein in order to 8 fulfill the provisions of this section. 9 10 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EAST 12 FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total amount appropriated for Technology Grants each fiscal year, an amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) 13 14 or eighteen percent (18%), whichever is greater each fiscal year, shall be 15 awarded through a grant or professional services contract for EAST 16 infrastructure personal services and operating expenses. The EAST 17 infrastructure grant or contract for personal services and operating expenses 18 shall be awarded to an entity that has personnel or experience, or both, in 19 implementing the EAST Initiative. 20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 21 through June 30, 2005. 22 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 23 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PRIORITIZATION OF FUNDING. The State Board of Education shall give first 25 26 priority to allocating funding for those line-items contained in Section 1 of 27 this Act that further the State's goal of maintaining equitable funding of 28 students in the public schools of this State. Those line-items that further 29 this goal shall be those line-items that contribute to the State meeting the 30 Federal Range Ratio as it is described in 34 C.F.R. §§ 222.61, et seq. (1994). 31 32 33 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXPLOR-34 35 NET FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total appropriation authorized by this Act for Technology Grants the Department of Education shall make available one 36

1 hundred eighty seven thousand five hundred seventy five dollars (\$187,575) 2 each fiscal year for Explor-Net Program initiatives to teach students computer repair in a hands-on environment. The Department of Education shall 3 4 allocate General Revenue funding totaling no less than one hundred eighty 5 seven thousand five hundred seventy five dollars (\$187,575) each fiscal year 6 from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account to support the 7 Explor-Net Program. The Department shall either expend or have committed for 8 expenditure the monies allocated for the Explor-Net Program in order to 9 fulfill the provisions of this section. 10 11 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS 12 13 LEADERSHIP ACADEMY - REDUCTION OF FUNDS RESTRICTION. Upon determination by the Department of Education that a reduction in the amount of available 14 15 appropriation within the Department of Education Fund Account is required 16 from the amount appropriated, the reduction in the available appropriation 17 from the full amount appropriated for the Arkansas Leadership Academy shall be limited to the average percentage reduction in the other appropriations to 18 19 the Department of Education from the Department of Education Fund Account. 20 21 SECTION 24. Subsection (c) of Section 3 of uncodified Act 1288 of 1993, 22 as amended, concerning the Pygmalion Commission is repealed: 23 24 (c) The commission shall expire on June 30, 2003, unless the commission 25 is continued by further act of the Arkansas General Assembly. 26 27 SECTION 25. Arkansas Code Annotated 6-17-2104(j) of The Educator 28 Compensation Act of 2001 is amended to read as follows: 29 30 The required salary increase for targeted educators who are (i) prekindergarten teachers shall only be required to be implemented if the 31 32 local school district has received sufficient state funds as determined by 33 the Department of Education available to completely implement the required 34 salary increase or proportion thereof for the given fiscal year. 35 SECTION 26. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 36

1 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 2 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 3 4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 6 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 7 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 8 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

10 SECTION 27. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 11 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 12 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 13 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 14 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 15 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 16 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 17 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

19 SECTION 28. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 20 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 21 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 22 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of 23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that 24 the General Assembly recognizes the important contribution to education made 25 by the Pygmalion Commission on Nontraditional Education, and that recognizing 26 and identifying how the educational system is failing a child early enough to 27 provide meaningful intervention is necessary to improve the educational outcomes for at-risk students, and the Pygmalion Commission shall expire on 28 29 June 30, 2003 unless the General Assembly continues the Commission by further 30 act, and that Section 24 of this Act shall become effective immediately upon 31 its passage and approval, and that the General Assembly further recognizes 32 the financial hardships placed on school district resources if the required 33 salary increase authorized by The Educator Compensation Act of 2001 is to continue, and that Section 25 of this Act shall become effective immediately 34 35 upon its passage and approval due to the economic downturn of state revenues and insufficient resources to provide school districts with sufficient funds 36

1	to implement the required salary increase, and that in the event of an
2	extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of the
3	remaining sections of this Act beyond July 1, 2003, could work irreparable
4	harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
5	programs. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
6	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
7	safety:
8	(1) Section 24 and Section 25 of this act shall become effective on:
9	(A) The date of its approval by the Governor;
10	(B) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the
11	expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill;
12	or
13	(C) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
14	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto; and
15	(2) All other sections of this act shall become effective on July 1,
