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23	SECTION 1. (a)	The Department of Education is divided into two (2	<u>)</u>						
24	separate divisions as f	ollows:							
25	(1) The De	partment of Curriculum and Instruction; and							
26	<u>(2) The De</u>	partment of Accountability.							
27	(b)(l) The dutie	s and responsibilities of the Department of Curric	<u>ulum</u>						
28	and Instruction shall b	e as assigned by law and the State Board of Educat	ion.						
29	<u>(2) The du</u>	ties and responsibilities of the Department of							
30	Accountability shall be	to:							
31	<u>(A)(i</u>) Monitor the Arkansas education system to ensure							
32	compliance with federal	law and Arkansas statutes pertaining to education	:						
33	reform in Arkansas.								
34		(ii) Monitoring shall include all actions taken	<u>by</u>						
35	the Department of Educa	tion and local school districts;							
36	(B)	Establish a continuing review of the education fina	ance						



1	system in Arkansas at the state and district level that will include an
2	analysis of the level of adequacy and equity of the educational opportunity
3	in all school districts;
4	(C)(i) Verify the accuracy of reports of school, district,
5	and state performance by conducting, requesting, or upon the approval of the
6	state board, contracting for periodic program and fiscal audits as necessary.
7	(ii) The Department of Accountability shall monitor
8	and verify the accuracy of reports of the Department of Education and the
9	state board, including, but not limited to, the annual fiscal conditions of
10	grants, categorical programs, and other educational initiatives set forth by
11	the General Assembly;
12	(D) Conduct studies, and analyze, verify, and validate the
13	state assessment program through other external indicators of academic
14	progress, including, but not limited to, American College Test scores,
15	Scholastic Assessment Test scores, National Assessment of Education Progress
16	scores, Preliminary Scholastic Assessment Test scores, Advanced Placement
17	Program participation, standardized test scores, college remediation rates,
18	retention and attendance rates, dropout rates, and additional available data
19	on the efficiency of the system of schools and whether progress is being made
20	toward attaining the goal of providing all students with the opportunity for
21	an equitable and adequate education; and
22	(E)(i) Make biennial reports to the Governor and the House
23	Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education of the General
24	Assembly.
25	(ii) The first report is due on June 1 of each year
26	and the second report is due on December 1 of each year.
27	(c) All appropriations, unexpended balances, and other assets of the
28	Department of Education shall be divided between the two (2) divisions as
29	determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.
30	(d) All references to the Department of Education in the Arkansas Code
31	shall mean either the Department of Curriculum and Instruction or the
32	Department of Accountability, as determined by the state board.
33	(e)(1) All rights, duties, or functions assigned to the Director of
34	the Department of Education in the Arkansas Code shall be transferred to both
35	the Director of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction and the Director
36	of the Department of Accountability, unless otherwise designated by the state

1	board or this act.					
2	(2) All statutory appointments of the Director of the Department					
3	of Education to boards, committees, or commissions shall be filled by the					
4	Director of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, unless stated					
5	otherwise in this act.					
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7	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-11-102 is amended to read as follows:					
8	6-11-102. Director of the Department of Education — State Board of					
9	Education staff.					
10	(a)(1) Subject to confirmation by the Governor, the The State Board of					
11	Education is empowered to employ:					
12	(A) Shall employ, subject to the confirmation of the					
13	Governor, a person to act as the Director of the Department of Education, who					
14	Curriculum and Instruction;					
15	(B) Shall employ a person to act as the Director of					
16	Accountability; and					
17	(C)(i) May employ staff to work directly for the state					
18	board as may be necessary to carry out the functions of the state board.					
19	(ii) Funding for employees working directly for the					
20	board shall be provided from appropriations and funds authorized for the					
21	Department of Curriculum and Instruction and the Department of Accountability					
22	in proportion to each department's share of the total appropriation and funds					
23	authorized for both departments for personal services and operating expenses.					
24	(2) All persons employed by the state board shall serve at the					
25	pleasure of the Covernor state board.					
26	(b) $\frac{1}{1}$ The $\frac{1}{1}$ director shall devote all of his or her time to the					
27	duties of his or her office, shall act as an agent of the board, and perform					
28	other duties as are designated by the board and by statute.					
29	(c)(1) The Each person selected as the \underline{a} director must:					
30	(A) Be a person of good moral character, recognized as a					
31	leader in the field of education, and qualified technically and by experience					
32	to direct the work of the Department of Education <u>their respective</u>					
33	departments;					
34	(B) Hold the master's degree from an accredited					
35	institution;					
36	(C) Have had ten (10) years' experience as a teacher, five					

- 1 (5) of which must be of an administrative or supervisory nature; and
- 2 (D) Hold a valid state teacher's certificate.
- 3 (2) No person who is related within the fourth degree of 4 consanguinity or affinity to any member of the board shall be eligible to 5 serve as a director.
- 6 (d) It is the specific intention of this act to define and declare the 7 each director to be the employee of the State Board of Education.
- 8 (e)(1) The Each director, or a disbursing agent designated by him or
 9 her and approved by the state board, shall give bond to the State of Arkansas
 10 as provided by law for other disbursing agents conditioned for the faithful
 11 performance of his or her duties and the faithful accounting for all the
 12 school money of the state, of any county, or of any school district that may
 13 come into his or her hands.
- 14 (2) The bond shall be in a solvent surety company having a right
 15 to do business in the State of Arkansas and shall be approved by the <u>state</u>
 16 board.
- 17 (3) The premium on the bond shall be paid by the <u>state</u> board as 18 one of the expenses of the state board.
- 19 (f) The state shall furnish the each director and the employees of the
 20 state board with suitable offices and necessary office supplies and
 21 equipment.

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- SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-11-103 is amended to read as follows: 6-11-103. Officers.
- 25 (a) The State Board of Education shall elect one (1) of its number 26 chairman, one (1) vice chairman, and such other officers as the board deems 27 necessary to perfect its organization.
 - (b) The Director of the Department of Education shall act as ex officio secretary of the board without vote.

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- 31 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-11-104 is amended to read as follows:
- 32 6-11-104. Meetings.
- 33 (a) The State Board of Education shall meet a minimum of six (6) times 34 annually.
- 35 (b) The board <u>state</u> will meet each December to determine the meeting 36 dates for the following year.

- 1 (c)(1) Special meetings may be called by the chairman of the <u>state</u>
 2 board with no less than twenty-four (24) hours notice to the members and <u>the</u>
 3 Director of the Department of <u>Education</u> <u>Curriculum and Instruction</u>, and the
 4 <u>Director of the Department of Accountability</u>, and with timely responses from
 5 enough board members that they will attend the meeting so as to indicate that
 6 a quorum will be present.
- 7 (2) In the absence of the chairman, the director Director of the
 8 Department of Curriculum and Instruction or the Director of the Department of
 9 Accountability shall call a meeting on the request of three (3) members of
 10 the state board with the same notice and response requirements.
 - (3) If both the chairman and the <u>director</u> <u>directors</u> shall be absent or refuse to call a meeting, any three (3) members of the <u>state</u> board may call a meeting by utilizing the same notice and response requirements in notifying the members and the <u>office</u> <u>offices</u> of the <u>director</u> <u>directors</u>.

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- SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-11-105(c), concerning the powers and duties of the State Board of Education, is amended to read as follows:
- 18 (c) The <u>state</u> board may organize and, from time to time, change and
 19 alter the department into branches or sections as may be found necessary and
 20 desirable by the Director of the Department of <u>Education Curriculum and</u>
 21 <u>Instruction or the Director of the Director of the Department of</u>
 22 <u>Accountability</u> to perform all proper functions and to render maximum service
- relating to the operation and improvement of the general education programs of the state.

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- SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-11-110 is amended to read as follows: 6-11-110. Uniform system of records - Reports.
 - (a) The State Board of Education shall prescribe a uniform system of records to be kept by the school directors, principals, and teachers of schools.
- 31 (b) All the school officials and employees listed in subsection (a) of 32 this section shall make reports to the Director of the Department of 33 Education Accountability as may be designated by the state board.

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SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 6-11-111 is amended to read as follows: 6-11-111. Records of proceedings - Annual report.

1 The State Board of Education shall keep in the office of the 2 Department of Education Curriculum and Instruction a complete record of the minutes of its meetings and other proceedings and annually shall make a 3 4 report to the Governor which shall embody the report of the director. 5 The annual report of the board to the Governor shall be 6 transmitted by him to the General Assembly at the opening of the session. 7 (c) Such reports shall be printed by the state board and distributed 8 among the various school officers of the state. 9 10 SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 6-11-117 is amended to read as follows: 11 6-11-117. Copies of documents as evidence. 12 Copies of any papers or documents on file in the office of the 13 Department of Education Director of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction or the Director of the Department of Accountability authenticated 14 15 by him or her with the seal of the State Board of Education shall be 16 admissible in evidence with the same effect as the original. 17 18 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court in 19 20 Lake View School District No. 25 v. Huckabee, 351 Ark. 31 (2002) declared the 21 current system of education to be unconstitutional because it is both 22 inequitable and inadequate; and the Arkansas Supreme Court set forth the test 23 for a constitutional system to be one in which the State has an "absolute 24 duty" to provide an "equal opportunity to an adequate education"; the 25 Arkansas Supreme Court instructed the General Assembly to undertake actions 26 as necessary to provide an opportunity for an adequate and equitable 27 education for the children of Arkansas; and the provisions of this bill are 28 necessary steps toward accomplishing that goal. Therefore, an emergency is 29 declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the 30 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective 31 on: 32 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; 33 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, 34 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the 35 bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is

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
