Arkansas Code § 6-11-102 is amended to read as follows: 6-11-102. Director of the Department of Education — State Board of 18 19 Education staff. 20 (a)(1) Subject to confirmation by the Governor, the The State Board of 21 Education is empowered to employ: 22 (A) Shall employ, subject to the confirmation of the 23 Governor, a person to act as the Director of the Department of Education, who 24 Curriculum and Instruction; 25 (B) Shall employ a person to act as the Director of 26 Accountability; and 27 (C)(i) May employ staff to work directly for the state 28 board as may be necessary to carry out the functions of the state board. 29 (ii) Funding for employees working directly for the 30 board shall be provided from appropriations and funds authorized for the Department of Curriculum and Instruction and the Department of Accountability 31 32 in proportion to each department's share of the total appropriation and funds 33 authorized for both departments for personal services and operating expenses. 34 (2) All persons employed by the state board shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor state board. 35 36 (b) The Each director shall devote all of his or her time to the

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19	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-11-103 is amended to read as follows:
20	6-11-103. Officers.
21	(a) The State Board of Education shall elect one (1) of its number
22	chairman, one (1) vice chairman, and such other officers as the board deems
23	necessary to perfect its organization.
24	(b) The Director of the Department of Education shall act as ex
25	officio secretary of the board without vote.
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27	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-11-104 is amended to read as follows:
28	6-11-104. Meetings.
29	(a) The State Board of Education shall meet a minimum of six (6) times
30	annually.
31	(b) The \underline{state} board will meet each December to determine the meeting
32	dates for the following year.
33	(c)(1) Special meetings may be called by the chairman of the <u>state</u>
34	board with no less than twenty-four (24) hours notice to the members and $\underline{\text{the}}$
35	Director of the Department of Education Curriculum and Instruction, or the
36	<u>Director of the Department of Accountability</u> , and with timely responses from

- enough board members that they will attend the meeting so as to indicate that a quorum will be present.
 - (2) In the absence of the chairman, the director Director of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction or the Director of the Department of Accountability shall call a meeting on the request of three (3) members of the state board with the same notice and response requirements.
 - (3) If both the chairman and the <u>director</u> <u>directors</u> shall be absent or refuse to call a meeting, any three (3) members of the <u>state</u> board may call a meeting by utilizing the same notice and response requirements in notifying the members and the <u>office</u> offices of the <u>director</u> directors.

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- SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-11-105(c), concerning the powers and duties of the State Board of Education, is amended to read as follows:
- (c) The <u>state</u> board may organize and, from time to time, change and
 alter the <u>department departments</u> into branches or sections as may be found
 necessary and desirable by the Director of the Department of <u>Education</u>

 Curriculum and Instruction or the Director of the Department of
 Accountability to perform all proper functions and to render maximum service
- relating to the operation and improvement of the general education programs of the state.

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- SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-11-110 is amended to read as follows: 6-11-110. Uniform system of records - Reports.
 - (a) The State Board of Education shall prescribe a uniform system of records to be kept by the school directors, principals, and teachers of schools.
 - (b) All the school officials and employees listed in subsection (a) of this section shall make reports to the Director of the Department of Education Accountability as may be designated by the state board.

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- SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 6-11-111 is amended to read as follows: 6-11-111. Records of proceedings - Annual report.
- 33 (a) The State Board of Education shall keep in the office of the
 34 Department of Education Curriculum and Instruction a complete record of the
 35 minutes of its meetings and other proceedings and annually shall make a
 36 report to the Governor which shall embody the report of the director.

1	(b) The annual report of the board to the Governor shall be
2	transmitted by him to the General Assembly at the opening of the session.
3	(c) Such reports shall be printed by the state board and distributed
4	among the various school officers of the state.
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6	SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 6-11-117 is amended to read as follows:
7	6-11-117. Copies of documents as evidence.
8	Copies of any papers or documents on file in the office of the
9	Department of Education Director of the Department of Curriculum and
10	Instruction or the Director of the Department of Accountability authenticated
11	by him or her with the seal of the State Board of Education shall be
12	admissible in evidence with the same effect as the original.
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14	SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
15	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court in
16	Lake View School District No. 25 v. Huckabee, 351 Ark. 31 (2002) declared the
17	current system of education to be unconstitutional because it is both
18	inequitable and inadequate; and the Arkansas Supreme Court set forth the test
19	for a constitutional system to be one in which the State has an "absolute
20	duty" to provide an "equal opportunity to an adequate education"; the
21	Arkansas Supreme Court instructed the General Assembly to undertake actions
22	as necessary to provide an opportunity for an adequate and equitable
23	education for the children of Arkansas; and the provisions of this bill are
24	necessary steps toward accomplishing that goal. Therefore, an emergency is
25	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
26	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
27	<u>on:</u>
28	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
29	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
30	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
31	bill; or
32	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
33	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
