35	(2) Prepare and distribute p	lans and specific	ations for the	
36	construction and equipment of school buil	dings and approve	plans and	

- 1 expenditures of public school funds for all new school buildings; 2 (3) Recommend courses of study for the public schools and 3 teacher training institutions; 4 (4) Prescribe rules and regulations for the sanitary inspection 5 of all buildings and for the examination of pupils to detect contagious and 6 infectious diseases and physical defects; 7 (5) Issue certificates based upon credentials presented by 8 applicants for certificates to teach in the public schools of the state; 9 (6) Qualify and standardize public schools and prescribe 10 requirements for accrediting and grading public schools; 11 (7) Supervise the operation of school district budgets; 12 (8) Supervise the purchase and distribution of textbooks; 13 (9) Take such other action as it may deem necessary to promote 14 the physical welfare of school children and promote the organization and 15 increase the efficiency of the public schools of the state; 16 (10) Perform all other functions which may now or hereafter be 17 delegated to the board by law.
