- 2 TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this act, the Chief Fiscal
- 3 Officer of the State shall transfer on his books and those of the State
- 4 Treasurer and the Auditor of the State the sum of six million four hundred
- 5 thousand dollars (\$6,400,000) from funds received from the Jobs and Growth
- 6 Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2003, Public Law 108-27, to the Department
- 7 of Education Public School Fund Account.

- 12 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE
- 13 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRYFORWARD.
- 14 Any unexpended balance in the appropriations authorized for the Knowledge and
- 15 Skills Based Pay Pilot Program which remain at the close of the fiscal year
- 16 ending June 30, 2004 shall be carried forward and made available for the same
- 17 purpose for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2005.

- 22 SECTION 4. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
- 23 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
- 24 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
- 25 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
- 26 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
- 27 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
- 28 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
- 29 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
- 30 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

- 32 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
- 33 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
- 34 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
- 35 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
- 36 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by

1	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral		
2	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or		
3	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.		
4			
5	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General		
6	Assembly that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas requires the state to		
7	maintain a general, suitable, and efficient system of free public schools;		
8	that the Supreme Court of Arkansas issued an opinion in November 2002		
9	declaring the current school-funding system unconstitutional; that in order		
10	to implement a school-funding system that meets constitutional compliance,		
11	funds must be made available immediately to the Department of Education to		
12	provide assistance and support for schools; that this act is immediately		
13	necessary because the effectiveness of this Act on its passage and approval		
14	is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in		
15	this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Second		
16	Extraordinary Session of 2003, the delay in the effective date of this Act		
17	upon its passage and approval could work irreparable harm upon the proper		
18	administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,		
19	an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary		
20	for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become		
21	<pre>effective on:</pre>		
22	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
23	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the		
24	expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill;		
25	<u>or</u>		
26	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden,		
27	the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
