24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE	GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:		
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26	SECTION 1. Leg	islative findings.		
27	The General Asso	embly of the State of Arkansas has determined	that t	<u>here</u>
28	is an immediate need	for more money in order to maintain and operat	e the	
29	public schools in this	s state. These improvements are necessary to	provid	<u>.e</u>
30	for an adequate educa	tion for Arkansas students. The General Assem	bly ha	. <u>S</u>
31	determined that the co	urrent ad valorem property tax of twenty-five	(25) m	<u>ills</u>
32	established by Amendmo	ent 74 of the Arkansas Constitution for mainte	nance	and
33	operation is inadequa	te for the maintenance and operation of public	schoo	ls.
34	The General Assembly	finds that the best way to provide a quality e	ducati	.on
35	is by increasing the	uniform rate of ad valorem property tax under	Amendm	<u>ent</u>
36	74 of the Arkansas Cor	nstitution to twenty-eight (28) mills.		



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2	SECTION 2. Authorization.		
3	Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 74(b)(4) authorizes the General		
4	Assembly to propose an increase in the uniform rate of tax and submit the		
5	question to the electors of the state at the next general election.		
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7	SECTION 3. Millage levied.		
8	Subject to the approval of the voters at the next general election,		
9	there is established a uniform rate of ad valorem property tax of twenty-		
10	eight (28) mills to be levied on the assessed value of all taxable real,		
11	personal, and utility property in the state to be used solely for maintenance		
12	and operation of schools.		
13			
14	SECTION 4. Election.		
15	(a) The uniform rate of ad valorem property tax established by		
16	Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 74(b)(1) may only be increased by a majority		
17	of the electors of the state voting on the issue at the next general election		
18	and voting "For" the proposed increase in the uniform rate of tax.		
19	(b)(1) The ballot title and proposed increase shall be in the		
20	following form:		
21	"TO INCREASE THE ESTABLISHED UNIFORM RATE OF AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAX UNDER		
22	AMENDMENT 74(b)(1) OF THE ARKANSAS CONSTITUTION BY THREE (3) MILLS FROM		
23	TWENTY-FIVE (25) MILLS TO A TOTAL OF TWENTY-EIGHT (28) MILLS."

25	[] "FOR increasing the established uniform rate of ad valorem property tax		
26	by amending Arkansas Code Title 26, Chapter 80, Subchapter 2 to add a new

29	(a) There is established a uniform rate of ad valorem property tax of
