3	Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 74(b)(4) authorizes the General		
4	Assembly to propose an increase in the uniform rate of tax and submit the		
5	question to the electors of the state at the next general election.

7	SECTION 3. Millage levied.		
8	Subject to the approval of the voters at the next general election,		
9	there is established a uniform rate of ad valorem property tax of twenty-		
10	eight (28) mills to be levied on the assessed value of all taxable real,		
11	personal, and utility property in the state to be used solely for maintenance		
12	and operation of schools.		
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14	SECTION 4. <u>Election</u> .		
15	(a) The uniform rate of ad valorem property tax established by		
16	Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 74(b)(1) may only be increased by a majority		
17	of the electors of the state voting on the issue at the next general election		
18	and voting "For" the proposed increase in the uniform rate of tax.		
19	(b) The ballot title and proposed increase shall be in the following

25	[] "FOR increasing the established uniform rate of ad valorem property tax		
26	by amending Arkansas Code Title 26, Chapter 80, Subchapter 2 to add a new

29	(a)(1) There is established a uniform rate of ad valorem property tax		
30	of twenty-eight (28) mills to be levied on the assessed value of all taxable		
31	real, personal, and utility property in the state to be used solely for		
32	maintenance and operation of the schools.		
33	(2) The established uniform rate of ad valorem property tax of		
34	twenty-eight (28) mills is equal to the twenty-five (25) mills levied under

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1	(b) The uniform rate of ad valorem property tax of twenty-eight (28)
2	mills is effective for assessment years beginning January 1, 2004."
