21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22

23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the Office
24 of Information Technology for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following maximum
25 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the
26 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code
27 §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.
28 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual
29 salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of
30 said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying
31 positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the
32 Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101),
33 or its successor.

There is hereby appropriated, to the Office of Information Technology, to be payable from the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account, for personal services and operating expenses of the Office of Information Technology - Operations for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the following:

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29 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM OFFICE -

30 OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Office of Information

31 Technology, to be payable from the Geographic Information Systems Fund, to

32 carry out the duties, responsibilities and authority of the Arkansas State

33 Land Information Board as described by Arkansas Code 15-21-504; to create,

34 operate, and maintain GeoStor, the Arkansas Spatial Data Infrastructure and

35 to create, update, maintain and disseminate framework spatial data as defined

36 by Arkansas Code 15-21-502 of the Office of Information Technology -

 15 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
 17 FORWARD - ARKANSAS GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION OFFICE - OPERATIONS. At the close
 18 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, the Arkansas Geographic Information
 19 Office may certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State an unexpended
 20 amount of appropriation which shall than be transferred forward for the
 21 fiscal year ending June 30, 2007, for the sole purpose of providing payments
 22 for geographic information technology.

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 24 SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
 25 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
 26 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
 27 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
 28 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 29 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
 30 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
 31 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
 32 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

 34 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
 35 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
 36 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act

1 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
2 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
3 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
4 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
5 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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7 SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
8 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
9 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
10 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
11 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
12 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
13 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
14 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
15 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
16 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
17 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
