30 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FOOD 32 SERVICE. If Henderson State University cancels the current contract for food 33 service and chooses to operate the food service with University employees, 34 the President, upon authorization of the Board of Trustees, is allowed to 35 utilize the contingent positions contained in Section 1 of this Act, provided 36 he or she has obtained approval from the Department of Higher Education and

the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, who has sought prior review by the
 Arkansas Legislative Council.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
4 <u>2005</u> through June 30, 2005 <u>2007</u>.

6 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 8 ALLOWANCE. The Board of Trustees of Henderson State University may make 9 special allowances available to any coach who coaches more than one sport in 10 an amount not to exceed \$10,000 per year for any one coach during each year 11 of the 2003-2005 2005-2007 biennium. Further, if the special allowance funds authorized herein are utilized, Henderson State University shall report 12 annually to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee the exact disposition of 13 14 those special allowance funds.

SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 19 FUND 20 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged 21 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the 22 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief 23 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December 24 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or 25 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during 26 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due. 27 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the 28 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon 29 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal 30 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board 31 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year. 32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 33 2005 through June 30, 2005 2007. 34

35 SECTION 8. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 36 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds

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1 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 2 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 3 4 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures 5 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 6 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 7 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 8 with in disbursement of said funds.

10 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 11 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 12 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 13 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 14 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 15 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 16 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 17 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 18

19 SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 20 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 21 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of 22 23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 24 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the 25 26 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 27 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 28 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 29 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005. 30 31 32 33 34 35
