- 26 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is
- 27 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
- 28 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and
- 29 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly
- 30 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
- 31 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
- 32 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in
- 33 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the
- 34 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary
- 35 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the
- 36 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative

1 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of

- 2 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section.
- 3 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled
- 4 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is
- 5 void.
- 6 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as
- 7 established herein during the next biennium, the position(s) must be
- 8 requested as a new position(s) in the agencies biennial budget request.
- 9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2003}{2005}$
- 10 through June 30, 2005 2007.

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- 12 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. Child and
- 14 Family Life Institute. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be
- 15 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas
- 16 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract
- 17 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics
- 18 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family
- 19 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of
- 20 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and
- 21 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically
- 22 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health
- 23 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not
- 24 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and
- 25 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas
- 26 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-
- 27 Department of Pediatrics shall make *semi*-annual reports to the Arkansas
- 28 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services
- 29 offered through CHFLI.
- 30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect from July 1, $\frac{2003}{2005}$
- 31 through June 30, 2005 2007.

- 33 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 35 PURCHASING DEFINITIONS. (Z) Commodities and services for use in research,
- 36 education and treatment for the diagnosis, cure and prevention of disease

- 1 may, with administrative approval, be procured through a group purchasing
- 2 entity serving other public health institutions when substantial savings are
- 3 available. A report shall be filed annually with the Division of Legislative
- 4 Audit reflecting the justification of and the estimated savings accruing due
- 5 to the use of this exemption;
- 6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
- 7 2005 through June 30, 2005 2007.

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- 9 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code 19-4-906(a), Item No. (119),

- 15 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
- 16 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue,
- 17 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking
- 18 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
- 20 2005 through June 30, 2005 2007.

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- 22 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
- 24 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship
- 25 Program Loans and / or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and
- 26 Scholarship Program Loans and / or Scholarships have the goal of providing
- 27 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such
- 28 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for
- 29 "Medical Loans and Scholarships". The provisions of this section shall be in
- 30 effect only from July 1, 2003 2005 through June 30, 2005 2007.

1 SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES. 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| 2 | SECTION 37. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General |
| 3 | Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the |
| 4 | appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the |
| 5 | effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of |
| 6 | the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in |
| 7 | the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective |
| 8 | date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the |
| 9 | proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. |
| 10 | Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being |
| 11 | necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and |
| 12 | safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005. |
