22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
23

24 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for  
25 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2005-2007 biennium,  
26 the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be  
27 governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act  
28 (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory  
29 thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum  
30 annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the  
31 provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons  
32 occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions  
33 of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-  
34 101), or its successor.

10 staff members. Upon approval by the President and the Board of Trustees,  
11 such funds shall be administered by the Chancellor, who shall assure that the  
12 total amount expended for such purposes does not exceed one hundred fifty  
13 thousand dollars (\$150,000) each fiscal year or so much thereof as may be  
14 authorized by the Board of Trustees. The funds authorized by this Section  
15 shall come from a source other than state tax dollars appropriated by the  
16 General Assembly or charges made to students for tuition, fees, room and  
17 board, or other purposes. Each year the Chancellor shall furnish to the  
18 President of the University of Arkansas, the Board of Trustees, and the  
19 Arkansas Legislative Joint Auditing Committee a report showing for each  
20 expenditure the date, the amount, the names of persons to whom the  
21 expenditure was made, and the purpose for which the expenditure was made.

22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~  
23 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

25 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL  
27 LANGUAGE AND RESTRICTIONS - AREA HEALTH EDUCATION CENTERS. The Chancellor at  
28 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall make periodic progress  
29 reports of AHEC programs to the Governor, the Legislative Council, and other  
30 interested interim committees of the General Assembly regarding the  
31 achievements, the expansion of the aforementioned programs, and amounts  
32 expended for the Area Health Education Centers.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~  
34 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

36 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CONTRACT  
2 RESTRICTIONS (PHYSICIAN TEACHERS AND TEACHERS IN OTHER HEALTH RELATED  
3 PROFESSIONS) AREA HEALTH EDUCATION CENTERS. Funds appropriated by this Act  
4 may be utilized for the purpose of contracting with physician-teachers and  
5 teachers in other health related professions residing only at sites located  
6 away from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Such funds are to  
7 be paid only for the purpose of teaching residents and students assigned to  
8 Area Health Education Centers. Contracts entered into with physician-  
9 teachers, teachers in other health related fields and their associates shall  
10 require the prior approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State only and  
11 be reported quarterly to the Legislative Council.

15 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

17 PROVISIONS FOR UNCLASSIFIED PATIENT CARE PERSONNEL. All unclassified  
18 positions employed to provide patient care at the University of Arkansas for  
19 Medical Sciences are eligible for overtime at the rate of one and one-half  
20 times their regular hourly rate. In addition to overtime, those unclassified  
21 patient care employees scheduled to work shifts outside of normal operating  
22 schedules may be eligible to receive up to twenty-four (24) percent of the  
23 hourly rate paid as a shift differential. In addition, all unclassified  
24 positions employed to provide patient care at the University of Arkansas for  
25 Medical Sciences will be eligible to receive incentive pay not to exceed 1.2  
26 times their base hourly rate. Employees required to be available for duty on  
27 nights, weekends and holidays will be eligible to receive standby pay  
28 equivalent of up to four hours of work per shift. Employees required to work  
29 in specialty areas will be eligible to receive up to ten (10) percent of the  
30 hourly rate paid as a specialty differential while working in such areas.  
31 When overtime, shift differentials, standby pay, incentive pay and/or  
32 specialty differential are provided to employees as herein described, the  
33 total may exceed the line item maximum salaries for those positions as  
34 included in this Act. The positions of Patient Care Administrator, Associate  
35 Administrator, and Assistant Administrator of Patient Care as authorized in  
36 regular salaries-operations section of this Act shall be excluded from

1 coverage of this Section. In addition, the Board of Trustees may also make  
2 special compensation allowances available, in such amounts as the Board may  
3 determine or justify equitable in view of the current requirements for  
4 Registered Nurses in the Clinical Programs of the University of Arkansas for  
5 Medical Sciences and the availability of Registered Nurses for employment in  
6 the Little Rock metropolitan area. However, under no condition shall the  
7 special allowances approved by the Board of Trustees for a single individual  
8 exceed the state line item maximum by more than 20% for those positions

 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ADMISSION  
 22 POLICY. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall admit one  
 23 hundred fifty (150) freshman students in each year of the ~~2003-2005~~ 2005-  
 24 2007 biennium into the College of Medicine. Provided that no funds shall be  
 25 expended to fund the positions of Chancellor, Dean of Medicine and any

22 PROVISIONS FOR ON-CALL STATUS AND STAND-BY AND SHIFT DIFFERENTIAL PAY FOR  
23 CERTAIN CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES WORKING IN CRITICAL AREAS. All classified  
24 positions employed in areas providing critical and emergency support of the  
25 clinical and physical operations of the University of Arkansas for Medical

27 eligible for on-call status and to receive stand-by pay not to exceed four  
28 hours of work per shift. In addition, these employees may be eligible to

4 a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level not  
5 to exceed \$113,588 ~~-\$107,904~~ per year. These positions are to be used by the  
6 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal  
7 services needs of the University during the ~~2003-2005~~ 2005-2007 biennium  
8 exceed the number of positions allocated to the University by the  
9 Legislature. The University shall provide justification to the Arkansas

22 justification to OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool".  
23 No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific

25 by the Legislative Council.

26 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is  
27 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by  
28 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and  
29 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly  
30 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be  
31 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.  
32 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in  
33 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the  
34 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary  
35 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the  
36 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative

1 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of

12 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. Child and  
14 Family Life Institute. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be  
15 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas  
16 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract  
17 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics  
18 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family  
19 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of  
20 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and  
21 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically  
22 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health  
23 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not  
24 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and  
25 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas  
26 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-  
27 Department of Pediatrics shall make ~~semi~~-annual reports to the Arkansas  
28 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services  
29 offered through CHFLI.

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect from July 1, ~~2003~~ 2005

33 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

35 PURCHASING DEFINITIONS. (Z) Commodities and services for use in research,  
36 education and treatment for the diagnosis, cure and prevention of disease

1 may, with administrative approval, be procured through a group purchasing  
2 entity serving other public health institutions when substantial savings are  
3 available. A report shall be filed annually with the Division of Legislative  
4 Audit reflecting the justification of and the estimated savings accruing due  
5 to the use of this exemption;

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~  
7 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

15 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences  
16 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue,  
17 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking  
18 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

1 SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND  
3 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged  
4 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the  
5 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief  
6 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December  
7 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or

5 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of  
6 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
7 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
8 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the  
9 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
10 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
11 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
12 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
