All apprentices in the University of Arkansas U.S. Department 22 of Labor Approved Apprentice Program shall be appointed into the State of 23 Arkansas Classified Pay Plan title of Grade 11 Apprentice Tradesman at the 24 then Labor Market Entry Rate. 25 Using successive Arkansas Department of Labor Prevailing Wage 26 Determination (ADLPWD) Building Rates for Washington County for the craft 27 title matching that Apprentice's craft training, individual Apprentices shall 28 be paid progressively increasing wages upon successful completion of 29 successive years of training for their craft. Progressively increasing, as 30 strongly encouraged for this type program by the U.S. Department of Labor, is defined as a percentage difference between the Apprentice's current salary 31 32 and the next year's ADLPWD Washington County Building Rates Basic Hourly Rate 33 for their chosen craft, but not less than the preceding year's wages with any 34 authorized cost of living (COLA) applied. 35 Upon successful completion of the Apprentice Program, fulfillment of all

related licensing requirements, and availability of an open Skilled Trades

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1 Worker position (if not already in a Grade 17 Skilled Trades Worker 2 position), all Apprentice Program graduates shall be promoted to a Grade 17 Skilled Trades Worker position and earn the ADLPWD Washington County Building 3 4 Rates Basic Hourly Rate for the classification of their chosen craft except 5 that: "No Apprentice Program graduate shall earn wages less than Grade 17 6 Skilled Trades Worker Level I." 7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 8 through June 30, 2007. 9 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE 10 11 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SUMMER SCHOOL 12 EMPLOYEES. Employees who, in addition to working during the regular school term also work during the summer months, shall be authorized as additional 13 14 compensation an amount not to exceed 1/12 of their annual salary for each 15 month or part thereof worked. Such additional compensation shall not be 16 construed as exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees. 17 Payment of additional compensation shall be limited to employees in the 18 following classifications: 19 SUMMER SCHOOL POSITIONS CLASS CODE 20 Teacher School for Math & Science 7611 21 Counselor School for Math & Science 7612 22 Dorm Supv. School for Math & Science 8808 25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 26 2003 July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2005 June 30, 2007. 27 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE 28 29 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TEACHER GRANT 30 RELATED FUNDING PROVISION. Teachers of the School for Mathematics and Sciences who, in addition to fulfilling annual teaching contract requirements 31 32 also write grants, grant progress reports and write and publish papers may be 33 authorized as additional annual compensation an amount up to 1/12 of their 34 annual salary. Such additional compensation shall not be construed as

exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees. The additional

compensation authorized by this section shall only be paid from a portion of

- 1 the grant monies received and shall not be paid from state general revenues 2 or Educational Excellence Trust Fund monies. 3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 4 through June 30, 2007. 5 6 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 8 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged 9 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the 10 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief 11 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December 12 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during 13 14 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due. 15 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the 16 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon 17 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal 18 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board 19 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 20 21 2005 through June 30, <del>2005</del> 2007. 22 SECTION 21. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 23 24 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 25 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 26 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 27 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 28 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures 29 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this 30 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 31 32 with in disbursement of said funds. 33 34 SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
  - that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act

1	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
2	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
3	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
4	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
5	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
6	
7	SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
8	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
9	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
10	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
11	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
12	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
13	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
14	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
15	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
16	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
17	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
