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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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26 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - VARIOUS DIVISIONS AND THE ARKANSAS
27 ARCHEOLOGICAL SURVEY. There is hereby established for the University of
28 Arkansas - Various Divisions and the Archeological Survey for the 2005-2007
29 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries
30 shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and
31 Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and
32 all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a
33 specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt
34 from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All
35 persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the
36 provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas

 24 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE
 25 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SUMMER SCHOOL
 26 EMPLOYEES. Employees who, in addition to working during the regular school
 27 term also work during the summer months, shall be authorized as additional
 28 compensation an amount not to exceed 1/12 of their annual salary for each
 29 month or part thereof worked. Such additional compensation shall not be
 30 construed as exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees.
 31 Payment of additional compensation shall be limited to employees in the
 32 following classifications:

6 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE
7 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TEACHER GRANT
8 RELATED FUNDING PROVISION. *Teachers of the School for Mathematics and*
9 *Sciences who, in addition to fulfilling annual teaching contract requirements*
10 *also write grants, grant progress reports and write and publish papers may be*
11 *authorized as additional annual compensation an amount up to 1/12 of their*
12 *annual salary. Such additional compensation shall not be construed as*
13 *exceeding the maximum salary authorized for said employees. The additional*
14 *compensation authorized by this section shall only be paid from a portion of*
15 *the grant monies received and shall not be paid from state general revenues*

20 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
22 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
23 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
24 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
25 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
26 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
27 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
28 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.
29 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the
30 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon
31 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal
32 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board
33 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year.

1 SECTION 22. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
2 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
3 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
4 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
5 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
6 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
7 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
8 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
9 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
10 with in disbursement of said funds.

12 SECTION 23. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
13 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
14 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
15 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
16 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
17 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
18 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
19 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

20
21 SECTION 24. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
22 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
23 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
24 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
25 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
26 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
27 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
28 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
29 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
30 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
31 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
