21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for
24 the Pulaski Technical College for the 2007-2009 biennium, the following
25 maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the
26 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code
27 §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.
28 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual
29 salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of
30 said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying
31 positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the
32 Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101),
33 or its successor.

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26 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for the
 27 Pulaski Technical College for the 2007-2009 biennium, the following maximum
 28 number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help",
 29 payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: three hundred
 30 (300) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to
 31 exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or
 32 its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

34 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,
 35 to the Pulaski Technical College, to be payable from the Pulaski Technical
 36 College Fund, for personal services of the Pulaski Technical College for the

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20 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 22 PRIORITIES. A high priority of the Pulaski Technical College shall be to
 23 provide access to high quality education that promotes student learning and
 24 support the economic development of the state.

25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
 26 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

28 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SALARY
 30 ADJUSTMENTS: Due to the competitive nature of the employment market in
 31 Central Arkansas, Pulaski Technical College shall be authorized to employ new

26 The College shall report all such salary adjustments to the Higher Education
 27 Section of the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) no later than the pay
 28 period following the salary adjustment and OPM shall report these adjustments
 29 to the Uniform Personnel Committee at its next scheduled meeting. Authority
 30 under this section shall be subject to audit and may be rescinded for
 31 improper use or application. Provisions under this section shall be in
 32 effect July 1, ~~2005~~ 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.
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34 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
 36 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged

1 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
2 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
3 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
4 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
5 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
6 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.
7 This certification, signed by the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the
8 President or Chancellor will be forwarded by February 28 of each year or upon
9 release of the previous year's audit by Legislative Audit to the Chief Fiscal
10 Officer of the State and the Legislative Council accompanied by the Board
11 approved published annual financial statement for the preceding fiscal year.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2005~~
13 2007 through June 30, ~~2007~~ 2009.

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15 SECTION 10. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
16 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
17 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
18 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
19 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
20 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
21 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
22 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
23 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
24 with in disbursement of said funds.

25
26 SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
27 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
28 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
29 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
30 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
31 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
32 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
33 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

34
35 SECTION 10. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
36 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the

1 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
2 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2007 is essential to the operation of
3 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
4 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
5 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2007 could work irreparable harm upon the
6 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
7 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
8 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
9 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2007.
