## For An Act To Be Entitled

10 AN ACT TO DESIGNATE A PORTION OF HIGHWAY 67 AS  
11 ROCK 'N' ROLL HIGHWAY 67; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

14 TO DESIGNATE A PORTION OF HIGHWAY 67 AS  
15 ROCK 'N' ROLL HIGHWAY 67.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
19

20 SECTION 1. NOT TO BE CODIFIED. Legislative findings:

21 The General Assembly finds that:

22 (1) Arkansas has a great and varied music heritage;

23 (2) The heritage includes a new type of music that emerged in  
24 the 1940s and 1950s called "rock 'n' roll";

25 (3) Some of the early "rock 'n' roll" legends that regularly  
26 traveled Highway 67 through Jackson County, Lawrence County, and Randolph  
27 County to perform their new type of music included:

28 (A) Elvis Presley;

29 (B) Billy Lee Riley;

30 (C) Sonny Burgess;

31 (D) Roy Orbison;

32 (E) Jerry Lee Lewis;

33 (F) Carl Perkins;

34 (G) Johnny Cash;

35 (H) Conway Twitty, whose real name was Harold Jenkins;

36 (I) Charlie Rich;
