10	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE ARKANSAS ANESTHESIOLOGIST
11	ASSISTANT ACT; TO PROVIDE FOR LICENSURE OF
12	ANESTHESIOLOGIST ASSISTANTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

15	Subtitle
16	TO ESTABLISH THE ARKANSAS
17	ANESTHESIOLOGIST ASSISTANT ACT; AND TO
18	PROVIDE FOR LICENSURE OF
19	ANESTHESIOLOGIST ASSISTANTS.
20	
21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22	
23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 95, is amended to add an
24	additional subchapter to read as follows:
25	<u>Subchapter 12 — Arkansas Anesthesiologist Assistant Act</u>
26	
27	<u>17-95-1201. Title.</u>
28	This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas
29	<u>Anesthesiologist Assistant Act".</u>
30	
31	<u>17-95-1202. Definitions.</u>
32	As used in this subchapter:
33	(1) "Anesthesiologist assistant" means a graduate of an approved
34	program who is licensed to perform services delegated and directly supervised
35	by a supervising anesthesiologist;
36	(2) "Approved program" means a program for the education and



1	training of anesthesiologist assistants approved by the Arkansas State
2	Medical Board; and
3	(3) "Direct supervision" means the on-site, personal supervision
4	by an anesthesiologist who is:
5	(A) Present in the office or surgical or obstetrical suite
6	when a procedure is being performed in the office or surgical or obstetrical
7	suite; and
8	(B) In all instances immediately available to provide
9	assistance and direction to the anesthesiologist assistant while anesthesia
10	services are being performed.
11	
12	<u> 17-95-1203. Arkansas State Medical Board — Powers and duties under</u>
13	subchapter.
14	(a) The Arkansas State Medical Board shall:
15	(1) License and renew the licenses of qualified applicants under
16	this subchapter;
17	(2)(A) Maintain a current list of every person licensed to
18	practice under this subchapter.
19	(B) The list under subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section
20	shall show:
21	(i) The licensee's last known place of residence;
22	and
23	(ii) The date and number of the license;
24	(3) Discipline persons who violate this subchapter and incur
25	necessary expenses of the prosecution;
26	(4) Keep a record of all proceedings of the board under this
27	subchapter and make the record available to the public for inspection during
28	reasonable business hours;
29	(5) Conduct hearings regarding discipline of a licensee under
30	this subchapter or denial, revocation, or suspension of a license under this
31	subchapter; and
32	(6)(A) Share information on a case-by-case basis of a person
33	whose license has been suspended, revoked, or denied under this subchapter.
34	(B) The information under subdivision (a)(6)(A) of this
35	section shall include:
36	(i) The name of the person whose license has been

1	suspended, revoked, or denied;
2	(ii) The type and cause of the action;
3	(iii) The date upon which a penalty is imposed;
4	(iv) The type of penalty imposed; or
5	(v) The duration of the penalty imposed.
6	(C) The information under subdivision (a)(6)(A) of this
7	section shall be available for public inspection during reasonable business
8	hours and shall be supplied to licensing entities in other states upon
9	request.
10	(b) The board may:
11	(1) Promulgate rules as necessary to enforce this subchapter
12	consistent with state law;
13	(2) Employ personnel as necessary to assist the board in
14	performing its duties under this subchapter;
15	(3) Establish license renewal requirements and procedures under
16	this subchapter as deemed appropriate by the board ;
17	(4)(A) Secure the services of resource consultants as deemed
18	necessary by the board in performing its duties under this subchapter.
19	(B) The board shall reimburse resource consultants for all
20	actual and necessary expenses incurred while engaged in consultative service
21	to the board; and
22	(5) Establish license examination fees under this subchapter by
23	<u>rule.</u>
24	
25	<u>17-95-1204. Licensing.</u>
26	(a) A person applying for licensure as an anesthesiologist assistant
27	under this subchapter shall submit an application to the Arkansas State
28	Medical Board on forms approved by the board.
29	(b) An application under this section is not effective for more than
30	one (1) year from the date of the original submission of the application and
31	fee, after which time an applicant shall submit to the board a new
32	application and fee.
33	(c)(l) To qualify for licensure under this subchapter, an applicant
34	under this section shall obtain a passing score on the examination
35	administered through the National Commission for Certification of
36	<u>Anesthesiologist Assistants.</u>

1	(2) A passing score under subdivision (c)(1) of this section
2	shall be established by the National Commission for Certification of
3	Anesthesiologist Assistants.
4	
5	17-95-1205. Supervisory relationship.
6	(a) An anesthesiologist or anesthesiologist group, upon entering into
7	a supervisory relationship with a licensed anesthesiologist assistant, shall
8	file with the Arkansas State Medical Board a written protocol, including
9	without limitation:
10	(1) The name, address, and license number of the
11	anesthesiologist assistant;
12	(2) The name, address, license number, and United States Drug
13	Enforcement Administration registration number of each anesthesiologist who
14	will supervise the anesthesiologist assistant;
15	(3) The address of the anesthesiologist assistant's primary
16	practice location where the anesthesiologist assistant may practice;
17	(4) The date the protocol was developed and the date of all
18	revisions;
19	(5) The designation and signature of the primary supervising
20	anesthesiologist;
21	(6) The signatures of the anesthesiologist assistant and all
22	supervising anesthesiologists;
23	(7) The duties and functions of the anesthesiologist assistant;
24	(8) The conditions or procedures that require the provision of
25	care by a supervising anesthesiologist; and
26	(9) The procedures to be followed in the event of an anesthetic
27	emergency.
28	(b) The protocol required under subsection (a) of this section shall
29	be filed with the board before the anesthesiologist assistant begins practice
30	with the supervising anesthesiologist or anesthesiology group.
31	(c) An anesthesiologist assistant may perform the following duties
32	under the direct supervision of an anesthesiologist:
33	(1) Obtain a comprehensive patient history and present the
34	history to the supervising anesthesiologist;
35	(2) Pretest and calibrate anesthesia delivery systems and
36	monitor, obtain, and interpret information from the anesthesia delivery

1	systems;
2	(3) Assist the supervising anesthesiologist with implementation
3	of monitoring techniques;
4	(4) Establish basic and advanced airway interventions, including
5	intubations of the trachea and performance of ventilator support;
6	(5) Administer intermittent vasoactive drugs and start and
7	adjust vasoactive infusions;
8	(6) Administer anesthetic drugs, adjuvant drugs, and accessory
9	drugs;
10	(7) Perform epidural anesthetic procedures and spinal anesthetic
11	procedures;
12	(8) Administer blood, blood products, and supportive fluids;
13	(9) Support life functions during the administration of
14	anesthesia, including without limitation induction and intubation procedures,
15	the use of appropriate mechanical supportive devices, and the management of
16	fluids, electrolytes, and blood component balances;
17	(10) Recognize and take appropriate corrective action for
18	abnormal patient responses to anesthesia, adjunctive medication, or other
19	forms of therapy;
20	(11) Participate in management of the patient while in the post-
21	anesthesia recovery area, including the administration of supporting fluids;
22	and
23	(12) Place special peripheral and central venous and arterial
24	lines for blood sampling and monitoring as appropriate.
25	(d)(l) The supervising anesthesiologist shall delegate only tasks and
26	procedures to the anesthesiologist assistant that are within the supervising
27	anesthesiologist's scope of practice.
28	(2) The anesthesiologist assistant may work in any setting that
29	is within the scope of practice of the supervising anesthesiologist's
30	practice.
31	(e) Continuity of supervision in practice settings requires the
32	anesthesiologist assistant to document in the anesthesia record any change in
33	supervising enasthesislesist

34	(f) The tasks and procedures performed by the anesthesiologist
