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29	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-85-304 is amended to read as follows:		
30	6-85-304. Eligibility.		
31	(a) A student is eligible to receive an Arkansas Workforce Challenge		
32	Scholarship for an academic year if the student applies to the Division of		
33	Higher Education by a date determined by the Division of Higher Education		
34	preceding the academic year and:

27	available in an equal amount to every student eligible to receive a		
28	scholarship under this subchapter.

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18	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 85, Subchapter 3, is amended			
19	to add an additional section to read as follows:

21	(a) An approved institution of higher education or certificate program			
22	accepting funds under this subchapter shall submit an annual report to the			
23	Division of Higher Education that includes without limitation the following:			
24	(1) The number of students who graduate with a degree, license,

26	(2) A comparison of the enrollment data and graduation data;			
27	(3) Job placement statistics;			
28	(4) Starting salaries of graduates; and

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1 SECTION 6. DO NOT CODIFY. Rules. 2 (a) When adopting the initial rules required under this act, the Division of Higher Education shall file the final rules with the Secretary of 3 4 State for adoption under § 25-15-204(f): (1) On or before ninety (90) days from the effective date of 5 6 this act; or 7 (2) If approval under § 10-3-309 has not occurred by ninety (90) 8 days from the effective date of this act, as soon as practicable after 9 approval under § 10-3-309. 10 (b) The division shall file the proposed rules with the Legislative Council under § 10-3-309(c) sufficiently in advance of ninety (90) days from 11 12 the effective date of this act, so that the Legislative Council may consider the rules for approval before ninety (90) days from the effective date of 13 14 this act. 15 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 16 17 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Constitution, 18 Article 19, § 14 was amended by Issue 1 of 2024 to allow state lottery 19 proceeds to fund vocational or technical school scholarships for Arkansans; 20 that there are workforce needs within the state, and the current law needs to be amended immediately in order to effectuate this change voted for by the 21 22 people that would allow Arkansans to benefit from this change in the use of 23 lottery proceeds; and that this act is immediately necessary because the process and procedures to distribute these scholarships need to be updated as 24 25 quickly as possible in order to provide scholarship funding for Arkansans that would allow them to receive training and join the workforce of the 26 27 state. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and 28 29 safety shall become effective on: 30 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; 31 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, 32 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or 33 34 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 35 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
