13	(A) Ensure that all security data within the public school
14	district or open-enrollment public charter school is accessible by a local
15	law enforcement agency; and
16	(B) Coordinate with local law enforcement agencies to
17	establish appropriate access protocols with respect to security data.
18	(2) Accessible security under subdivision (e)(1) of this section
19	includes cameras, maps, and access control.
20	(f)(l) Any records, information, photographs, audio and visual
21	representations, schematic diagrams, surveys, recommendations, or
22	consultations or portions of consultations, that relate directly to the
23	physical security or fire safety of a public school district or an open-
24	enrollment public charter school facility or reveal security or fire safety
25	systems that are accessed or held by a government agency are not public
26	records and not available for public inspection under the Freedom of
27	Information Act of 1967, § 25-19-101 et seq.
28	(2) Information under subdivision (f)(1) of this section may be
29	disclosed:
30	(A) To the property owner or leaseholder of the public
31	school district or open-enrollment public charter school facility;
32	(B) In furtherance of the official duties and
33	responsibilities of the government agency that holds the information;
34	(C) To another local, state, or federal agency in
35	furtherance of that agency's official duties and responsibilities; or
36	(D) Upon a showing of good cause before a court of

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1	competent jurisdiction.
2	(g) This section does not apply to a statewide open-enrollment public
3	charter school that operates primarily as a virtual school.
4	(h) The Department of Education may adopt rules to implement this
5	section.
