3	(B) Within the Arkansas Better Chance Program there is	
4	established the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success Program for	
5	providing appropriate early care and education programs for children three	
6	(3) years of age and four (4) years of age as identified under § 6-45-108(a)	
7	from birth through five (5) years of age.	
8	(C) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education	
9	shall establish the same criteria and qualifications for eligibility to	
10	participate in the Arkansas Better Chance Program and the Arkansas Better	
11	Chance for School Success Program.	
12	(D) A child from birth through five (5) years of age who	
13	meets at least one (1) of the following qualifications shall be eligible to	
14	participate in the Arkansas Better Chance Program or the Arkansas Better	
15	Chance for School Success Program:	
16	(i) The child has a family gross income not	
17	exceeding two hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty level;	
18	(ii) The child has a parent who does not have a high	
19	school diploma or a GED;	
20	(iii) The weight of the child at birth was below	
21	five pounds (5 lbs.) and nine ounces (9 oz.);	
22	(iv) The child has a parent who was under eighteen	
23	(18) years of age at the birth of the child;	
24	(v) An immediate family member of the child has a	
25	history of substance abuse or addiction;	
26	(vi) The child has a demonstrable developmental	
27	delay as identified through an official screening;	
28	(vii) The child is eligible for services under the	
29	Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq., as it	
30	existed on January 1, 2025;	
31	(viii) The child is income-eligible for Title I	
32	programs;	
33	(ix) The child has limited English language	
34	<pre>proficiency; or</pre>	
35	(x) The child has a parent who has a history of	
36	abuse or neglect or the child is a victim of abuse or neglect.	

1 (2)(A) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education shall 2 award grants or contracts to appropriate early childhood programs selected by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education in accordance with 3 4 specified programmatic standards. 5 (B)(i) These standards will shall be developed by the 6 Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, with the advice and 7 assistance of the Arkansas Early Childhood Commission. 8 (ii) Standards for funding the Home Instruction for 9 Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) U.S.A. will shall be developed in 10 conjunction with the Arkansas HIPPY Advisory Board. 11 (C) The Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool 12 Youngsters (HIPPY) U.S.A. regional technical assistance and training center 13 shall be defined and funded as an integral part of the Home Instruction for 14 Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) U.S.A. to provide necessary training, 15 technical assistance, and program support to program sites in Arkansas. 16 (b) The programmatic standards and other rules necessary for the 17 implementation of the Arkansas Better Chance Program and the Arkansas Better 18 Chance for School Success Program shall be adopted by the State Board of 19 Education in accordance with the provisions of the Arkansas Administrative 20 Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq. 21 (c)(1) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education may expend a 22 maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds to administer the Arkansas 23 Better Chance Program and the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success 24 Program and to monitor Arkansas Better Chance Program and Arkansas Better 25 Chance for School Success Program grantees to ensure compliance with 26 programmatic standards. 27 (2) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education may 28 contract with the Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education to 29 administer the Arkansas Better Chance Program and the Arkansas Better Chance 30 for School Success Program. 31 32 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-45-108 is repealed. 6-45-108. Criteria for determining need. 33

(a)(1) All children three (3) years of age and four (4) years of age

who are members of a family with a gross family income not exceeding two

hundred percent (200%) of the federal poverty guidelines are eligible to

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1	attend an Arkansas Better Chance for School Success Program if there is an
2	Arkansas Better Chance for School Success Program available in the school
3	district where the child resides and if there is available space for the
4	child to attend the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success Program.
5	(2) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education and the
6	Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education may develop a fee
7	schedule and establish eligibility based on family income for children who
8	are not eligible under subdivision (a)(1) of this section, but priority
9	enrollment shall be allowed to children eligible under subdivision (a)(1) of
10	this section.
11	(b) The Division of Elementary and Secondary Education and the
12	Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education shall review various
13	criteria for identifying and targeting the areas of the state with the
14	greatest need for early childhood programs.
15	(c) The State Board of Education, with the advice and assistance of
16	the Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education, shall adopt the
17	appropriate criteria for identifying Arkansas children with the greatest need
18	to participate in Arkansas Better Chance for School Success Program-funded
19	early childhood programs.
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
