28	(a) (1) It is found and determined by	the General Assembly that	
29	29 granting local <u>public</u> school districts great	er flexibility in scheduling	
30	30 instructional time can reap educational bene	efits for the students and	
31	31 financial rewards for the <u>public</u> school dist	rict.	
32	32 <u>(2)</u> It is the intent of this se	ection to authorize local <u>public</u>	
33	33 school districts to initiate and maintain pu	blic school educational programs	
34	on a four-day school-week basis, so long as	on a four-day school-week basis, so long as $\underline{ ext{if}}$ planned instructional time $\underline{ ext{is}}$

1	(b) As used in this section, "four-day school week" means an	
2	educational program in which all students attend school for four (4) days a	
3	week but no fewer than the total number of hours required by the Standards	
4	for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts in a five-	
5	day school week.	
6	(c) $\underline{(1)}$ The board of directors of \underline{any} a public school district \underline{is}	
7	authorized to may initiate and maintain a four-day school week in any or all	
8	of the public schools in the <u>public</u> school district.	
9	(2) The state board and the Department of Education shall not	
10	have the authority to approve or deny the decision of a public school	
11	district board of directors to initiate and maintain a four-day school week	
12	in any or all of its public schools under subdivision (c)(1) of this section.	
13	(d)(1) The State Board of Education state board shall establish	
14	appropriate standards, guidelines, and rules for only the following:	
15	(A) The determination of average daily membership of	
16	<pre>public school districts and for the distribution of state aid to each local</pre>	
17	school district that elects to operate any or all of the public schools of	
18	its school district on a four-day school-week basis, to provide the school	
19	district with an equitable share of aid funds designated to equate a four-day	
20	school-week operation by the school district to the educational opportunities	
21	provided by a school district offering a five-day school week;	
22	(B) The requirement that each public school district that	
23	initiates and maintains a four-day school week for any or all of its public	
24	schools under this section shall:	
25	(i)(a) Average six (6) hours of instruction per	
26	school day and thirty (30) hours of instruction per school week.	
27	(b) The hourly requirements under subdivision	
28	(d)(1)(B)(i)(a) of this section may be met with four (4) seven-and-one-half-	
29	hour school instructional days.	
30	(c) A public school district that initiates	
31	and maintains a four-day school week in a public school that provides	
32	instruction to students in grades nine through twelve (9-12) shall meet the	
33	clock-hour equivalency of one hundred twenty (120) clock hours for a Carnegie	
34	unit;	
35	(ii)(a) Provide documentation to the Division of	
36	Elementary and Secondary Education to determine the success of the	

1	educational program.	
2	(b) Assessment measures utilized by the	
3	division under subdivision (d)(l)(B)(ii)(a) of this section shall include	
4	without limitation state-approved criterion-referenced tests and other	
5	assessment instruments required or approved by the division; and	
6	(iii) Include the four-day school week on the agenda	
7	for the public school district's required annual report to the public to	
8	determine local support for and provide for continual community input into	
9	the success and continuation of four-day school weeks; and	
10	(C) The forfeiture of the ability to initiate and maintain	
11	a four-day school week under this section if a public school district:	
12	(i) Is classified by the state board as in need of	
13	<u>Level 5 - Intensive support; and</u>	
14	(ii) Demonstrates persistent underperformance, as	
15	$\underline{\text{defined}}$ by state benchmarks, on the state-approved criterion-referenced $\underline{\text{test}}$	
16	and other assessment instruments required or approved by the division.	
17	(2) Provided, however, that a A public school district shall not	
18	receive any more state financial aid for offering a four-day school week of	
19	instruction than it would have received for offering a five-day school week	
20	of instruction.	
21	(3) The state board and the department shall not promulgate	
22	rules regarding public school districts that initiate and maintain a four-day	
23	school week for any or all of its public schools that are in addition to the	
24	requirements under this subsection (d).	
25	(4) A public school district that initiates and maintains a	
26	four-day school week for any or all of its public schools under this section	
27	shall:	
28	(A) Demonstrate compliance with the requirements under	
29	subdivision (d)(l) of this section through a state-approved electronic	
30	application; and	
31	(B) Not be required to submit additional reports or	
32	demonstrations of compliance with the requirements under subdivision (d)(1)	
33	of this section to the state board or division.

35	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
36	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that school districts must	

1	determine and publish their school calendars in advance of the upcoming 2025-
2	2026 school year; that school districts must have their school calendars
3	established in order to prepare appropriate staffing, operational, and
4	financial needs; that parents, students, staff members, and others associated
5	with school districts must know in advance of the upcoming school year what
6	the school calendar will be in order to make necessary arrangements; and that
7	this act is immediately necessary to ensure school districts have the
8	required information to arrange for and provide constitutionally mandated
9	education to enrolled students. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist,
10	and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
11	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
12	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
13	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
14	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
15	bill; or
16	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
17	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
