24	WHEREAS, the people of the State of Arkansas have amended the Arkansas
25	Constitution to limit their Representatives to the United States Congress to
26	serving three (3) two-year terms and their Senators to the United States
27	Congress to serving two (2) six-year terms; and

29	WHEREAS, other states limit the terms their delegations to the United
30	States Congress may serve; and

32	WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court decreed in the case of U.S.
33	Term Limits, Inc. v. Thornton, that terms of members elected to the United
34	States Congress may be limited only by an amendment to the United States
35	Constitution; and

1 WHEREAS, the people of the various states have consistently 2 demonstrated, at the ballot box and in opinion polls, their overwhelming 3 desire to limit the terms of members serving in the United States Congress; 4 and 5 6 WHEREAS, under Article V of the United States Constitution, amendments 7 to the United States Constitution may be proposed by the United States 8 Congress whenever two thirds (2/3) of both houses deem it necessary, or on 9 the application of the legislatures of two thirds (2/3) of the several states 10 the United States Congress shall call a convention for the purpose of 11 proposing amendments, 12 13 NOW THEREFORE, 14 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL 15 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE SENATE, A MAJORITY OF ALL 16 MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO: 17 18 THAT the General Assembly hereby makes an application to the United 19 States Congress, as provided by Article V of the United States Constitution, 20 to call a convention limited to proposing an amendment to the United States 21 Constitution to set a limit on the number of terms that a person may be 22 elected as a member of the United States House of Representatives and to set 23 a limit on the number of terms that a person may be elected as a member of 24 the United States Senate. 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Secretary of State is hereby directed to 27 transmit copies of this application to the President of the United States 28 Senate, the Secretary of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United 29 States House of Representatives, the Clerk of the United States House of 30 Representatives, the Chair of the Judiciary Committee of the United States 31 House of Representatives, the members of the Arkansas congressional 32 delegation, and the presiding officers of each of the legislative houses in the several states, requesting their cooperation. 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT this application shall be considered as covering

the same subject matter as the applications from other states to the United
