9	TO REMEMBER BOXER TOMMY MORRISON OF GRAVETTE FOR HIS
10	LEGENDARY BOXING SKILLS THAT BROUGHT RENOWN TO HIM

15	TO REMEMBER BOXER TOMMY MORRISON OF
16	GRAVETTE FOR HIS LEGENDARY BOXING SKILLS
17	THAT BROUGHT RENOWN TO HIM AND TO THE
18	STATE OF ARKANSAS.

20	WHEREAS, Tommy "The Duke" Morrison, formerly of Omaha, Nebraska, passed
21	away on September 1, 2013, at the age of forty-four (44); and
22	
23	WHEREAS, Tommy "The Duke" Morrison was born in Gravette, Arkansas, on
24	January 2, 1969, to a mother, Diana, of Native American ancestry and a
25	father, Tim, of Scottish ancestry; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, Tommy "The Duke" Morrison spent his teenage years in Oklahoma,
28	and his father encouraged him to take up boxing during the 1970s, a sport in
29	which Morrison found immediate success; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, Tommy "The Duke" Morrison acquired his nickname, "The Duke",
32	based on a claim that he was a distant relative of famed actor Marion "John
33	Wayne" Morrison, who was also nicknamed "The Duke"; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, after graduating from high school, Tommy "The Duke" Morrison
36	received a football scholarship to Emporia State University, and in the same



1	year won the Regional Heavy Weight Title, Kansas City Golden Gloves, and									
2	advanced to the National Golden Gloves in Omaha, Nebraska, where he won the									
3	majority of his fights; and									
4										
5	WHEREAS, also in that same year, Tommy "The Duke" Morrison took part in									
6	the Western Olympic trials, qualified for the nationals, and garnered the									
7	tournament's Outstanding Fighter award; and									
8										
9	WHEREAS, Tommy "The Duke" Morrison had accumulated numerous wins as a									
10	boxer when he was spotted in 1989 by actor Sylvester Stallone, who, after									
11	watching one of Morrison's bouts, arranged a script reading and cast Morrison									
12	in the film "Rocky V" as Tommy "The Machine" Gunn, a young and talented									
13	protege of retired main character Rocky Balboa; and									
14										
15	WHEREAS, among his many victories, Tommy "The Duke" Morrison became the									
16	new World Boxing Organization heavyweight champion in 1993 by defeating									
17	heavyweight boxing legend George Foreman; and									
18										
19	WHEREAS, Tommy "The Duke" Morrison's professional boxing record									
20	encompassed fifty-two (52) fights, of which he won forty-eight and lost three									
21	(48-3), and his amateur boxing record encompassed two hundred twenty-two									
22	fights, of which he won two hundred two and lost twenty (202-20); and									
23										
24	WHEREAS, the World Boxing Organization said Tommy "The Duke" Morrison									
25	would be remembered best for his dangerous punching power and especially his									
26	left hook, and two-time heavyweight champion Pinklon Thomas ranked Morrison									
27	ahead of Mike Tyson as the hardest puncher he had ever faced,									
28										
29	NOW THEREFORE,									
30	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL									
31	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:									
32										
33	THAT the House of Representatives remember boxer Tommy Morrison of									
34	Gravette for his legendary boxing skills that brought renown to him and to									
35	the State of Arkansas.
