28	WHEREAS, Lorie T	WHEREAS, Lorie Tudor has been employed by the Arkansas Department of		
29	Transportation for forty-one (41) years, during which time she became the			
30	first female director of the department in 2020; and

32	WHEREAS, Director Tudor became a Clerk Typist in the Equipment and			
33	Procurement Division, thus beginning her career within the department; and

35	WHEREAS, Directo	or Tudor worked at t	he department for thirteen (13)	
36	years before deciding	to explore the poss	ibility of becoming an engineer,	



1 which began with taking night classes; and 2 WHEREAS, after discovering her love of and affinity for mathematics, 3 4 Director Tudor quit her job with the department in order to obtain a 5 bachelor's degree in civil engineering, often driving several hours between 6 Little Rock and Memphis, Tennessee, in order to complete classes at the 7 University of Memphis, all while maintaining her role as a wife and mother; 8 and 9 10 WHEREAS, upon graduating from the University of Memphis, Director Tudor 11 accepted a job with the department as a Civil Engineer I in its Planning and 12 Research Division; and 13 14 WHEREAS, while at the department, Director Tudor quickly rose in ranks 15 and passed her professional engineer exam on the first try; and 16 17 WHEREAS, according to Director Tudor, one of her biggest projects at 18 the department was transforming a cash forecast system, which took her two 19 (2) years and coordination between the Information Technology and Fiscal 20 Services Divisions; and 21 22 WHEREAS, Director Tudor oversaw countless projects during her time at 23 the department, including leading during the Hernando de Soto Bridge closure 24 on Interstate 40, reorganizing the department to streamline operations and 25 better serve the public in an efficient and responsive manner, and initiating the design and development of the ARDOT Fallen Worker Memorial to honor those 26 27 individuals whose lives were lost in service to the people of the State of 28 Arkansas; and 29 30 WHEREAS, Director Tudor received numerous awards throughout her career 31 at the department, including being inducted into the University of Arkansas's 32 Academy of Civil Engineering in 2018, receiving the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials' Alfred E. Johnson Achievement 33 34 Award in 2019, and receiving the Associated General Contractors of Arkansas 35 SIR (Skill, Integrity, Responsibility) Award in 2024; and

1 WHEREAS, Director Tudor became director of the department only a few 2 weeks after the outbreak of coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19), thus being thrust 3 into managing not only one of the largest departments in the State of 4 Arkansas, but also the health and well-being of thousands of department 5 employees and the continuation of day-to-day services that were essential for 6 the operation of the state's transportation system; and 7 8 WHEREAS, when asked about her career and impact on the department, 9 Director Tudor stated, "Women must be confident in who they are and not be 10 apologetic for being a woman. Be yourself, whomever that is. People will respond to your genuineness .. Hard work and having a dream go a long way . 11 12 . . I know that there is a purpose for me being here, because if you look at 13 it on paper, I shouldn't be here. Sometimes I think, 'What am I doing at 14 this desk, how did this happen?' Deep down, I'm still that little clerktypist that was struggling to make ends meet . . . Anything worth achieving 15 16 is not going to be easy."; and 17 18 WHEREAS, Director Tudor has inspired countless individuals, especially 19 women, to pursue careers in engineering and similar fields, demonstrating 20 that ambition and determination can break barriers and redefine 21 possibilities; and 22 23 WHEREAS, Director Tudor's leadership, resilience, kindness, and 24 tenacity will leave a lasting impact on the State of Arkansas, and her 25 influence will continue to resonate for years to come, 26 27 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL 28 29 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 30 31 THAT the House of Representatives recognize Arkansas Department of 32 Transportation Director Lorie Tudor and her positive impact on the State of 33 Arkansas. 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption, a copy of this resolution shall be 35 36 provided to Director Tudor by the Chief Clerk of the House of
