35	States Armed Forces, the armed forces of allies of the United States, and the

2	WHEREAS, the United States Armed Forces became involved in Vietnam		
3	because the United States Government wanted to provide direct military		
4	support to the government of the Republic of Vietnam to defend against the		
5	growing threat of communism from the Democratic Republic of Vietnam; and

7	WHEREAS, citizens of Arkansas answered their country's call as they		
8	have in every armed conflict in which the United States has been a		
9	participant; and		
10			
11	WHEREAS, some Arkansans served in or off the coast of the Republic of		
12	Vietnam, while others served in critical roles such as training and		
13	logistics; and		
14			
15	WHEREAS, more than fifty-eight thousand (58,000) members of the United		
16	States Armed Forces lost their lives in the Vietnam War, including five		
17	hundred ninety-two (592) Arkansans; and		
18			
19	WHEREAS, in 1982, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial was dedicated in		
20	Washington, D.C., to commemorate the members of the United States Armed		
21	Forces who died or were declared missing in action in Vietnam; and		
22			
23	WHEREAS, the Arkansas Vietnam Veterans Memorial is inscribed with the		
24	names of Arkansans who lost their lives in the Vietnam War, and the memorial		
25	was dedicated on the grounds of the State Capitol in Little Rock on March 7,		
26	1987, by retired United States Army General William Westmoreland; and

28	WHEREAS, the Vietnam War was an extremely divisive issue among the		
29	people of the United States and a conflict that caused a generation of		
30	veterans to have to wait too long for the public of the United States to		
31	acknowledge and honor their efforts and services; and

33	WHEREAS, members of the United States Armed Forces who bravely and		
34	faithfully served the United States during the Vietnam War were often wrongl		
35	criticized for the decisions of policymakers that were beyond the control of
