17	WAR VETERANS DAY AND MARCH 2025 AS
18	VIETNAM ERA VETERANS MONTH IN ARKANSAS
19	IN APPRECIATION OF THE SACRIFICES AND
20	CONTRIBUTIONS MADE BY VIETNAM WAR
21	VETERANS.

23	WHEREAS, the Vietnam War was fought in the Republic of Vietnam from
24	1955 to 1975 and involved regular forces from the Democratic Republic of
25	Vietnam and Viet Cong guerilla forces in armed conflict with the United
26	States Armed Forces, the armed forces of allies of the United States, and the
27	armed forces of the Republic of Vietnam; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, the United States Armed Forces became involved in Vietnam
30	because the United States Government wanted to provide direct military
31	support to the government of the Republic of Vietnam to defend against the
32	growing threat of communism from the Democratic Republic of Vietnam; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, citizens of Arkansas answered their country's call as they
35	have in every armed conflict in which the United States has been a
36	participant; and

2	WHEREAS, some Arkansans served in or off the coast of the Republic of
3	Vietnam, while others served in critical roles such as training and
4	logistics; and
5	
6	WHEREAS, more than fifty-eight thousand (58,000) members of the United
7	States Armed Forces lost their lives in the Vietnam War, including five
8	hundred ninety-two (592) Arkansans; and
9	THIRDRAG 1 1000 of Mr. W. W. M. J.
10	WHEREAS, in 1982, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial was dedicated in
11	Washington, D.C., to commemorate the members of the United States Armed
12	Forces who died or were declared missing in action in Vietnam; and
13 14	WHEREAS, the Arkansas Vietnam Veterans Memorial is inscribed with the
15	names of Arkansans who lost their lives in the Vietnam War, and the memorial
16	was dedicated on the grounds of the State Capitol in Little Rock on March 7,
17	1987, by retired United States Army General William Westmoreland; and
18	1907, by rectice entitle beated nimy concius william webconcretains, and
19	WHEREAS, the Vietnam War was an extremely divisive issue among the
20	people of the United States and a conflict that caused a generation of
21	veterans to have to wait too long for the public of the United States to
22	acknowledge and honor their efforts and services; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, members of the United States Armed Forces who bravely and
25	faithfully served the United States during the Vietnam War were often wrongly
26	criticized for the decisions of policymakers that were beyond the control of
27	those servicemen and servicewomen; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, recognizing March 29, 2025, as Vietnam War Veterans Day and
30	March 2025 as Vietnam Era Veterans Month in Arkansas is an appropriate way to
31	honor the members of the United States Armed Forces who served in Vietnam;
32	and
33	
34	WHEREAS, it is important for all Arkansans to express appreciation for
35	the veterans of the Vietnam War, to demonstrate a resolve that the people of
36	the State of Arkansas shall never forget the sacrifices and service of a

1	generation of veterans who served in the Vietnam War, and to promote
2	awareness of the faithful service and contributions of the veterans of the
3	Vietnam War era,
4	
5	NOW THEREFORE,
6	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL
7	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
8	
9	THAT the House of Representatives recognize March 29, 2025, as Vietnam
10	War Veterans Day and March 2025 as Vietnam Era Veterans Month in Arkansas in
11	appreciation of the sacrifices and contributions made by Vietnam War
12	veterans.
