SECTION 38. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED 10 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event 11 12 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas 13 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric 14 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount 15 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven 16 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as 17 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year 18 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to 19 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents 20 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical 21 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide 22 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of 23 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the 24 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services, 25 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will 26 27 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount 28 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for 29 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if 30 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve 31 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars 32 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of 33 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and 34 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of 35 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of

Disbursement of funds 5 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 6 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 7 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 8 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 9 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restriction 10 Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where 11 applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and 12 Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 13 14 15 SECTION 40. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 16 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 17 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 18 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 19 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 20 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 21 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 22 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 23 24 SECTION 41. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 25 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 26 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 27 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2025 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 28 29 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 30 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2025 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 31

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programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act

being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health

and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2025.
