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21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(a)(2), concerning per-student	•
22	foundation funding amounts under the Public School Funding Act of 2003, i	.s
23	amended to read as follows:	
24	(2)(A) For the $\frac{2023-2024}{2025-2026}$ school year, the foundati	.on
25	funding amount is equal to seven thousand six hundred eighteen dollars	
26	(\$7,618) eight thousand one hundred sixty-two dollars (\$8,162) multiplied	by
27	the school district's average daily membership for the previous school ye	ar.
28	(B) For the 2024 2025 <u>2026-2027</u> school year and each	
29	school year thereafter, the foundation funding amount is equal to seven	
30	thousand seven hundred seventy one dollars (\$7,771) eight thousand three	
31	hundred seventy-one dollars (\$8,371) multiplied by the school district's	
32	average daily membership for the previous school year.	
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34	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(b)(2)(A), concerning alternat	ive
35	learning environment funding under the Public School Funding Act of 2003,	is
36	amended to read as follows:	

1	(A)(i) For the $\frac{2023-2024}{2025-2026}$ school year,
2	alternative learning environment funding shall be four thousand nine hundred
3	eighty seven dollars (\$4,987) five thousand two hundred twelve dollars
4	(\$5,212) multiplied by the number of identified alternative learning
5	environment students enrolled during the previous school year.
6	(ii) For the 2024-2025 <u>2026-2027</u> school year,
7	alternative learning environment funding shall be five thousand eighty-six
8	dollars (\$5,086) five thousand three hundred forty-one dollars (\$5,341)
9	multiplied by the number of identified alternative learning environment
10	students enrolled during the previous school year.
11	(iii) Funding for students in alternative learning
12	environments shall be distributed based on rules promulgated by the State
13	Board of Education.
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15	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(b)(3), concerning funding for
16	English learners under the Public School Funding Act of 2003, is amended to
17	read as follows:
18	(3)(A) For the $\frac{2023-2024}{2025-2026}$ school year, funding for
19	students who are identified as English learners shall be three hundred sixty
20	six dollars (\$366) three hundred seventy-five dollars (\$375) for each
21	identified English learner.
22	(B) Funding for English learners shall be distributed to
23	public school districts for students who have been identified as not
24	proficient in the English language based upon a state-approved English
25	proficiency assessment instrument.
26	(C) Funds allocated for English learners to public school
27	districts under this subchapter shall be expended only for eligible
28	activities as identified in current rules promulgated by the State Board of
29	Education and are a supplement to funding for national school lunch students
30	provided in subdivision (b)(4) of this section.
31	(D) For the $\frac{2024-2025}{2026-2027}$ school year and each
32	school year thereafter, funding for students who are identified as English
33	learners shall be three hundred sixty six dollars (\$366) three hundred
34	eighty-four dollars (\$384) for each identified English learner.
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SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(b)(4)(A), concerning Enhanced

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1 Student Achievement funding under the Public School Funding Act of 2003, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 (4)(A) Enhanced Student Achievement Funding for each identified 4 national school lunch student shall be as follows: 5 (i) For a public school district in which ninety 6 percent (90%) or more of the previous school year's enrolled students are 7 national school lunch students, the amount of per-student Enhanced Student 8 Achievement Funding for the 2023-2024 2025-2026 school year is one thousand six hundred thirteen dollars (\$1,613) one thousand six hundred fifty-three 9 dollars (\$1,653) and for the 2024-2025 2026-2027 school year is one thousand 10 six hundred thirteen dollars (\$1,613) one thousand six hundred ninety-four 11 12 dollars (\$1,694); 13 (ii) For a public school district in which at least seventy percent (70%) but less than ninety percent (90%) of the previous 14 15 school year's enrolled students are national school lunch students, the 16 amount of per-student Enhanced Student Achievement Funding for the 2023-2024 17 2025-2026 school year is one thousand seventy-six dollars (\$1,076) one 18 thousand one hundred three dollars (\$1,103) and for the 2024-2025 2026-2027 19 school year is one thousand seventy-six dollars (\$1,076) one thousand one 20 hundred thirty dollars (\$1,130); and 21 (iii) For a public school district in which less 22 than seventy percent (70%) of the previous school year's enrolled students 23 are national school lunch students, the amount of per-student Enhanced 24 Student Achievement Funding for the 2023-2024 2025-2026 school year is five hundred thirty-eight dollars (\$538) five hundred fifty-one dollars (\$551) and 25 26 for the 2024-2025 2026-2027 school year is five hundred thirty-eight dollars 27 (\$538) five hundred sixty-five dollars (\$565). 28 29 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code \S 6-20-2305(b)(5)(C)(i), concerning 30 professional development funding for professional learning communities under 31 the Public School Funding Act of 2003, is amended to read as follows: 32 (C)(i) For the $\frac{2023-2024}{2025-2026}$ school year and 33 each school year thereafter, additional funding up to sixteen million five 34 hundred thousand dollars (\$16,500,000) provided for professional development 35 above the amount in subdivision (b)(5)(A) of this section shall be used by

the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education for the development and

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1	administration of professional learning communities for the benefit of public
2	school districts.
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4	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(b)(6)(A), concerning the
5	statewide target average annual salary for teachers under the Public School
6	Funding Act of 2003, is amended to read as follows:
7	(6)(A)(i) Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, for school
8	districts identified by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education as
9	having an average annual teacher salary below the statewide target average
10	annual salary, teacher salary equalization funding shall be equal to one
11	hundred eighty-five dollars (\$185) multiplied by the average daily membership
12	of the school district for the previous school year.
13	(ii) For the $\frac{2023-2024}{2025-2026}$ and $\frac{2024-2025}{2026-2026}$
14	$\underline{2027}$ school years, the statewide target average annual salary shall be fifty-
15	one thousand eight hundred twenty-two dollars (\$51,822).
16	(iii) The House Committee on Education and the
17	Senate Committee on Education shall set jointly the statewide target average
18	annual salary for the $\frac{2025-2026}{2027-2028}$ and $\frac{2026-2027}{2028-2029}$ school
19	years, and each biennium thereafter, as part of the adequacy review process
20	required under § 10-3-2102.
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
