8	sufficient to pay capital start-up costs for fluoridation equipment for the
9	system have become available from any source other than tax revenue or
10	service revenue regularly collected by the company, corporation,
11	municipality, county, or other government agency that owns or controls the
12	water system.
13	(2) A licensed civil engineer recognized or employed by the
14	department who is familiar with the design, construction, operation, and
15	maintenance of fluoridation systems shall determine for the department
16	whether the capital start-up costs claimed under subdivision (d)(l) of this
17	section are reasonable.
18	(e) A water system for a city in this state that receives its water
19	supply from a community in another state is not required to comply with this
20	section until a substantially similar fluoridation program is enacted for the
21	water system of the community in the other state.
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
