9	AN ACT TO AMEND THE DATE OF THE PRIMARY ELECTION; TO
10	PROVIDE THAT THE PREFERENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION SHALL
11	BE HELD IN MARCH; TO CHANGE THE DATE OF THE FISCAL
12	SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY; AND FOR OTHER
13	PURPOSES.

17	TO AMEND THE DATE OF THE PRIMARY
18	ELECTION; TO PROVIDE THAT THE
19	PREFERENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION SHALL BE
20	HELD IN MARCH; AND TO CHANGE THE DATE OF
21	THE FISCAL SESSION OF THE GENERAL
22	ASSEMBLY.

24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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26	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 7-7-203(a) and (b), concerning the dates of
27	the general primary election and preferential primary election, are amended
28	to read as follows:
29	(a) The general primary election shall be held+
30	(1) For years in which the office of Governor will appear on the
31	ballot at the general election, on the third Tuesday in June preceding the
32	general election; and
33	(2) For years in which the office of President of the United
34	States will appear on the ballot at the general election, on the Tuesday four
35	(4) weeks following the preferential primary election.
36	(b) The preferential primary election shall be held+

1	(1) For years in which the office of Governor will appear on the
2	ballot at the general election, on the Tuesday four (4) weeks before the
3	general primary election; and
4	(2) For years in which the office of President of the United
5	States will appear on the ballot at the general election, on the first
6	Tuesday after the first Monday in March.
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8	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-7-203(c)(1), concerning the dates of the
9	general primary election and preferential primary election, is amended to
10	read as follows:
11	(c)(1) The party filing period shall be a one-week period beginning
12	and ending on the following dates and times:
13	(A) For years in which the office of Governor will appear
14	on the ballot at the general election, beginning at 12:00 noon one (1) week
15	prior to the first day in March and ending at 12:00 noon on the second day in
16	March; and
17	(B) For years in which the office of President of the
18	United States will appear on the ballot at the general election, beginning at
19	12:00 noon on the first Monday in November preceding the general primary
20	election and ending at 12:00 noon on the eighth day thereafter.
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22	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 7-7-304(a)(1), concerning the names to be
23	included on the ballots in a preferential primary, is amended to read as
24	follows:
25	(a)(1) The Secretary of State shall certify to all county boards of
26	election commissioners full lists of the names of all candidates who have
27	filed party certificates with him or her to be placed on the ballots in their
28	respective counties at the preferential primary election not less than+
29	(A) Seventy-five (75) days before a preferential primary
30	election that is held in May under § 7-7-203; and
31	(B) Ninety-two ninety-two (92) days before a preferential
32	primary election that is held in March under § 7-7-203.
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34	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 7-7-304(b)(1), concerning the names to be
35	included on the ballots in a preferential primary, is amended to read as
36	follows:

1	(b)(1) The county clerk shall certify to the county board of election
2	commissioners full lists of the names of all candidates who have filed party
3	certificates with him or her to be placed on the ballot at the preferential
4	primary election not less than+
5	(A) Seventy-five (75) days before a preferential primary
6	election that is held in May under § 7-7-203; and
7	(B) Ninety-two ninety-two (92) days before a preferential
8	primary election that is held in March under § 7-7-203.
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10	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 7-7-305(b)(1), concerning the printing of
11	ballots and draw for ballot position, is amended to read as follows:
12	(b)(1) The order in which the names of the respective candidates are
13	to appear on the ballots at all preferential and general primary elections
14	shall be determined by lot at the public meeting of the county board of
15	election commissioners held not later than+
16	(A) Seventy-two (72) days before a preferential primary
17	election that is held in May under § 7-7-203; and
18	(B) Eighty-nine eighty-nine (89) days before a
19	preferential primary election that is held in March under § 7-7-203.
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21	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 10-2-101(b)(1), concerning the time for
22	meeting by the General Assembly in fiscal session, is amended to read as
23	follows:
24	(b)(1) The General Assembly shall meet in a fiscal session to consider
25	appropriation bills in each even-numbered year at 12:00 noon on the+
26	(A) Second Monday in February in years in which the
27	preferential primary election is held in May under § 7-7-203; and
28	(B) Second second Wednesday in April in years in which the
29	preferential primary election is held in March under § 7-7-203.
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31	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 10-2-112(a)(1), concerning the prefiling of
32	bills and resolutions, is amended to read as follows:
33	(a)(1) The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives and the
34	Secretary of the Senate, under the direction and supervision of the Speaker
35	of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate,
36	shall establish a system for the prefiling of bills and resolutions beginning

1	on:
2	(A) November 15 of each year preceding a regular session
3	of the General Assembly; and
4	(B) The second Monday of January of each year of a fiscal
5	session of the General Assembly which is held in a year in which the
6	preferential primary election is held in May under § 7-7-203; and
7	(C) The second Monday of March of each year of a fiscal
8	session of the General Assembly which is held in a year in which the
9	preferential primary election is held in March under § 7-7-203.
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11	SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 10-3-2104(d)(3), concerning reports under
12	the Continuing Advocacy Evaluation Act of 2004, is amended to read as
13	follows:
14	(3) If the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee
15	on Education find that the recommendations in the most recent adequacy
16	evaluation report filed under this section should be amended, the House
17	Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education, jointly or
18	separately, or both, shall advise in writing the President Pro Tempore of the
19	Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of their findings and
20	amendments to the adequacy evaluation report÷
21	(A) By November 1 of the calendar year before the
22	beginning of a fiscal session that is held in a year in which the
23	preferential primary election is held in May under § 7-7-203; and
24	(B) By by March 1 of the calendar year before the
25	beginning of a fiscal session that is held in a year in which the
26	preferential primary election is held in March under § 7-7-203.
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28	SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 19-4-304(b), concerning regular and fiscal
29	session preparations, is amended to read as follows:
30	(b) The secretary shall submit the annual revenue forecast to the
31	Legislative Council:
32	(1) By December 1 of the year preceding a fiscal session that is
33	held in a year in which the preferential primary election will be held in May
34	under § 7-7-203;
35	(2) By February l of a year preceding a fiscal session that is
36	held in a year in which the preferential primary election is held in March

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     under § 7-7-203; and
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                 (3)(2) No later than sixty (60) days before the start of a
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     regular session.
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
