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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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19	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-54-102 is amended to read as
20	follows:
21	5-54-102. Obstructing governmental operations.
22	(a) A person commits the offense of obstructing governmental
23	operations if the person:
24	(1) Knowingly obstructs, impairs, or hinders the performance of
2526	any governmental function; (2) Knowingly refuses to provide information requested by an
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28	employee of a governmental agency relating to the investigation of a case brought under Title IV-D of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. § 651 et seq.,
29	and is the physical custodian of the child in the case;
30	(3) Fails to submit to court-ordered scientific testing by a
31	noninvasive procedure to determine the paternity of a child in a case brought
32	under Title IV-D of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. § 651 et seq.; or
33	(4) Falsely identifies himself or herself to a law enforcement
34	officer or a code enforcement officer; or
35	(5) Having received personal service of a court-issued subpoena,
36	knowingly fails to appear to testify at a trial or court hearing.

1	(b)(l) Obstructing governmental operations by using or threatening to
2	use physical force is a Class A misdemeanor.
3	(2) A second or subsequent offense of obstructing governmental
4	operations under subdivision (a)(4) of this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
5	(3) The offense of obstructing governmental operations under
6	subdivision (a)(5) of this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
7	(4) Otherwise, obstructing governmental operations is a Class C
8	misdemeanor.
9	(c) This section does not apply to:
10	(1) Unlawful flight by a person charged with an offense;
11	(2) Refusal to submit to arrest;
12	(3) Any means of avoiding compliance with the law not involving
13	affirmative interference with a governmental function unless specifically set
14	forth in this section; or
15	(4) Obstruction, impairment, or hindrance of what a person
16	reasonably believes is a public servant's unlawful action.
17	(d)(1) As used in this section, "code enforcement officer" means an
18	individual charged with the duty of enforcing a municipal code, municipal
19	ordinance, or municipal regulation as defined by a municipal code, municipal
20	ordinance, or municipal regulation.
21	(2) "Code enforcement officer" includes a municipal animal
22	control officer.
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
