Pay rates for physicians and chief psychologists within the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services may 25 26 include the special allowances available to UAMS physicians and professional 27 faculty as authorized in Arkansas Code. Part of the salaries of such staff 28 will come from the receipt of professional income in the care of patients 29 and/or funds received from federal agencies, foundations and other private 30 sponsors in the support of research. Provided that any such allowance shall 31 not exceed, for any employee, an amount equal to two and one half times the 32 salary authorized by the General Assembly. - 11 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS
- 13 HEALTH CENTER. (A) The Department of Human Services shall not close the
- 14 Arkansas Health Center that provides skilled nursing through specialized
- 15 services and programs.
- 16 (B) The Department of Human Services shall continue to accept clients for
- 17 whom it has determined that skilled nursing and specialized services are
- 18 needed at the Arkansas Health Center.
- 19 (C) No funds shall be transferred or reduced from the Arkansas Health
- 20 Center, except for use as federal matching funds, below the approved funding
- 21 level on March 1, 2003 without the prior approval of the Arkansas Legislative
- 22 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.
- 23 (D) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue
- 24 funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General
- 25 Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the
- 26 appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations
- 27 authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue
- 28 Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the
- 29 Department of Human Services may operate more efficiently if some flexibility
- 30 is provided to the Department of Human Services authorizing broad powers
- 31 under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the
- 32 General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the
- 33 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section.
- 34 The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
- 35 Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of
- 36 approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled

1 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 2 void.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2024}{2025}$ through June 30, $\frac{2025}{2026}$.

SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL RATES OF PAY AND EMPLOYMENT WORK DAYS. For employees hired on or after July 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State Hospital in the classifications listed below, the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services Director shall implement salary adjustments utilizing the approved pay grid for teachers employed by the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf.

To achieve the salary adjustments, the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services is authorized to pay special rates of pay for classifications at the Arkansas State Hospital listed below:

Funding for the minimum compensation provided for in this section that is supported in whole or in part from general revenues, shall, if required, be provided by a transfer from the Performance Fund to the proper fund or fund account and in such amounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. The Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services shall in addition to the funds provided in this Act for Annual Career Service Recognition Payments from the Performance Fund, make available any funding generated from agency salary savings for such purposes from the funds or fund accounts as provided by law.

For employees hired on or after July 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State Hospital in the classifications listed above either a Certified Masters

Teacher or a Certified Bachelors Teacher, the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services Director shall set the number of work days for the employment year to equal the number of days worked by those employed in the same classifications at the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf. The accrual, use, and carryover of sick days, personal days, and holidays of the employees at the Arkansas State Hospital that are hired on or after July 1, 2013, or current employees choosing to adopt this plan, shall be treated in

1 the same manner as those employed in the same classifications at the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf.

Those currently employed at the Arkansas State Hospital in the classifications listed above as of June 30, 2013, have the one-time option of adopting this language or continuing to operate under the same salary, leave and benefit plans they are currently receiving. Employees must make their decision by June 30, 2013.

Accrued annual and holiday leave, up to 240 hours, as of June 30, 2013, will be paid out to current employees choosing to adopt this plan. Any additional accrued annual and holiday leave will be forfeited. Accrued sick leave, as of June 30, 2013, shall be retained on file and shall be exhausted before any newly accrued sick leave may be taken.

All employees affected by this section shall be eligible to receive hazardous duty pay for time worked in eligible areas.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024 2025 through June 30, 2025 2026.

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SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY FORWARD - COMMUNITY BASED CRISIS INTERVENTION CRISIS SERVICES. Any unexpended balance of funds allocated for Community Based Crisis Intervention Crisis Services in the Department of Human Services - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services from the Behavioral Health Services Fund Account which remains at the close of each state fiscal year shall be carried forward to the next state fiscal year to be used for the same intent and purposes as set forth in law. Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein may be carried forward under the following conditions:

- (1) Prior to June 30, 2024 2025, the Agency shall, by written statement, set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;
- (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission, or Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the

- l written request set forth in (1) above;
- 2 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission, or Institution shall provide a 3 written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
- 4 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written

- 17 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AGING AND
- 19 ADULT SERVICES MATCHING FUNDS. The funds appropriated for state match for
- 20 the Arkansas Senior Olympics Program in this Act shall be paid on a two-to-
- 21 one state/local matching basis. The Senior Arkansas Sports Organization must
- 22 certify its portion of the match to the Division of Aging, Adult, and
- 23 Behavioral Health Services before any funds appropriated for state match for
- 24 the Arkansas Senior Olympics Program in this Act are disbursed.
- 25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024

- 28 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

- 30 ADULT SERVICES NURSING HOME CARE ALTERNATIVES. Funding for "Nursing Home
- 31 Care Alternatives", as it appears in the Aging and Adult Services -
- 32 Operations appropriation may be used for home delivered meals, adult day
- 33 care, homemaker/chore, respite care, personal care, health promotion, and
- 34 other community-based activities. These funds may also be used to match
- 35 Medicaid community-based programs.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2024

1 <u>2025</u> through June 30, 2025 <u>2026</u>.

SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SENIOR CITIZEN CENTERS. The appropriation in this act for Senior Citizen Centers shall be distributed in the same manner as the funding formula requirements set out in the federal Older Americans Act funding law. The additional funding provided by this provision shall supplement and not supplant any monies currently funding services for Senior Citizen Centers.

The requirements in this section shall only be implemented in accordance with any necessary approval by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and in the event that additional general revenue funding is provided by the General Assembly for these purposes. Should additional funding provided for these purposes be insufficient to provide for the increases in full, the increases shall be provided to the extent that funding is made available.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2024}{2025}$ through June 30, $\frac{2025}{2026}$.

SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY FORWARD OF UNOBLIGATED GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS FOR SENIOR CITIZEN CENTERS. (a) On June 30, 2019, or as soon as is practicable to determine funds available as authorized in this Section, and each fiscal year thereafter the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall cause to be transferred on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and Auditor of State the balance of unobligated general revenue funds, excluding funds carried forward for other purposes, remaining in the Fund or Fund Accounts and the corresponding paying accounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, as set out in subsection (b) herein, to the Department of Human Services - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services paying account to be used exclusively for the disbursement of funds for Senior Citizen Centers in the amount of recouped and recovered general revenue not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000).

(b) Any unobligated general revenue, excluding funds carried forward for other purposes, remaining in the following Fund or Fund Accounts and the corresponding paying accounts at the end of the Fiscal Year that would

- 1 normally be transferred into the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund as
- 2 recouped or recovered General Revenue shall be transferred as authorized in
- 3 subsection (a) herein:

- (1) Department of Human Services Administration Fund Account;

- 35 SECTION 21. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
- 36 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency

2	the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
3	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
4	Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal

6	the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
7	strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

9	SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
10	Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
11	contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
12	which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
13	Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
14	manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
15	summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
16	Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
17	
18	SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
19	General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
20	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
21	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2025 is essential to the operation of
22	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
23	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
24	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2025 could work irreparable harm
25	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
26	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
27	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
28	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2025.
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
