10	allocated as follows:		
11	(1) If the sale of surplus computer or electronic equipment is		
12	made within the agency:		
13	(A) Sixty percent (60%) of the proceeds shall be returned		
14	to the owning agency; and		
15	(B) Fifteen percent (15%) Forty percent (40%) of the		
16	proceeds shall be deposited with the Marketing and Redistribution Section;

18	(C) Twenty-five percent (25%) of the proceeds shall be		
19	deposited into the Computer and Electronic Recycling Fund established by this		
20	chapter; and		
21	(2) If the sale of surplus computer or electronic equipment is

16	(b) Grant requests shall be considered based upon the following		
17	criteria:		
18	(1) The development of sustained processes for recovery,		
19	recycling, and demanufacturing of scrap computers and electronics;		
20	(2) Minimization and elimination of substantial volumes of this		
21	material as waste;		
22	(3) Creation of Arkansas jobs;
