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25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSA	AS:
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27	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code §§ 5-70-104, 5-70-105, and 5-	-70-106 are
28	repealed.	
29	5-70-104. Promoting prostitution in the first degree.	
30	(a) A person commits the offense of promoting prostitu	tion in the
31	first degree if he or she knowingly:	
32	(1) Advances prostitution by compelling a person	
33	force or intimidation to engage in prostitution or profits for	com such coercive
34	conduct by another; or	
35	(2) Advances prostitution or profits from prosti	itution of a
36	person less than eighteen (18) years of age.	



1	(b) Promoting prostitution in the first degree is a:
2	(1) Class D felony under subdivision (a)(1) of this section;
3	(2) Class B felony under subdivision (a)(2) of this section.
4	(c)(l) In addition to any other sentence authorized by this section, a
5	person who violates this section by offering to pay, agreeing to pay, or
6	paying a fee to engage in sexual activity upon conviction shall be ordered to
7	pay a fine of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500).
8	(2) Fine payments received under subdivision (c)(1) of this
9	section shall be deposited as follows:
10	(A) Fifty percent (50%) into the Safe Harbor Fund for
11	Sexually Exploited Children; and
12	(B) Fifty percent (50%) into the Human Trafficking Victim
13	Support Fund.
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15	5-70-105. Promoting prostitution in the second degree.
16	(a) A person commits the offense of promoting prostitution in the
17	second degree if he or she knowingly advances prostitution or profits from
18	prostitution by managing, supervising, controlling, or owning, either alone
19	or in association with another, a house of prostitution or a prostitution
20	enterprise involving two (2) or more prostitutes.
21	(b) Promoting prostitution in the second degree is a Class A
22	misdemeanor.
23	(c)(l) In addition to any other sentence authorized by this section, a
24	person who violates this section by offering to pay, agreeing to pay, or
25	paying a fee to engage in sexual activity upon conviction shall be ordered to
26	pay a fine of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500).
27	(2) Fine payments received under subdivision (c)(1) of this
28	section shall be deposited as follows:
29	(A) Fifty percent (50%) into the Safe Harbor Fund for
30	Sexually Exploited Children; and
31	(B) Fifty percent (50%) into the Human Trafficking Victim
32	Support Fund.
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34	5-70-106. Promoting prostitution in the third degree.
35	(a) A person commits the offense of promoting prostitution in the
36	third degree if:

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1	(1) Having a possessory or proprietary interest in premises that
2	he or she knows is being used for prostitution, the person fails to make
3	reasonable effort to halt or abate the use for prostitution; or
4	(2) He or she knowingly advances prostitution or profits from
5	prostitution.
6	(b) Promoting prostitution in the third degree is a Class B
7	misdemeanor.
8	(c)(l) In addition to any other sentence authorized by this section, a
9	person who violates this section by offering to pay, agreeing to pay, or
10	paying a fee to engage in sexual activity upon conviction shall be ordered to
11	pay a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
12	(2) Fine payments received under subdivision (c)(1) of this
13	section shall be deposited as follows:
14	(A) Fifty percent (50%) into the Safe Harbor Fund for
15	Sexually Exploited Children; and
16	(B) Fifty percent (50%) into the Human Trafficking Victim
17	Support Fund.
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19	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 5, Chapter 70, is amended to add an
20	additional section to read as follows:
21	5-70-108. Promoting prostitution.
22	(a) As used in this section, "business" means a corporation,
23	partnership, sole proprietorship, limited liability corporation, or other
24	business entity organized under the laws of this state.
25	(b)(1) A person commits the offense of promoting prostitution in the
26	first degree if he or she knowingly:
27	(A) Advances prostitution by compelling a person by use of
28	physical force, intimidation, or coercion to engage in prostitution;
29	(B) Profits from the conduct of another to compel a person
30	by use of physical force, intimidation, or coercion to engage in
31	prostitution; or
32	(C) Advances prostitution or profits from prostitution of
33	a person less than eighteen (18) years of age.
34	(2) A person commits the offense of promoting prostitution in
35	the second degree if he or she knowingly:
36	(A) Manages, supervises, controls, or owns, either alone

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1	or in association with another person, a house of prostitution or a
2	prostitution enterprise involving two (2) or more individuals; or
3	(B) Manages or facilitates online platforms, digital
4	spaces, or any other medium used for the solicitation or advancement of
5	prostitution.
6	(3) A person commits the offense of promoting prostitution in
7	the third degree if he or she:
8	(A) Has a possessory or proprietary interest in premises
9	he or she knows is used for prostitution and fails to make reasonable efforts
10	to halt or abate the use for prostitution; or
11	(B) Knowingly advances prostitution or profits from
12	prostitution.
13	(c)(1) Promoting prostitution in the first degree is:
14	(A) For a first offense, a Class C felony for a violation
15	of subdivisions (b)(1)(A) and (b)(1)(B);
16	(B) For a second or subsequent offense, a Class B felony
17	for a violation of subdivisions (b)(l)(A) and (b)(l)(B); and
18	(C) A Class A felony for a violation of subdivision
19	<u>(b)(1)(C).</u>
20	(2) Promoting prostitution in the second degree is:
21	(A) For a first offense, a Class D felony; and
22	(B) For a second or subsequent offense, a Class C felony.
23	(3) Promoting prostitution in the third degree is:
24	(A) For a first offense, a Class A misdemeanor; and
25	(B) For a second or subsequent offense, a Class D felony.
26	(d) In addition to any other sentence authorized by this section, a
27	person who violates this section in a manner that involves the use of
28	physical force, intimidation, coercion, or a victim that is less than
29	eighteen (18) years of age upon conviction shall be ordered to pay a fine of:
30	(1) Two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) for a first
31	<u>offense;</u>
32	(2) Five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for a second offense; and
33	(3) Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for a third or subsequent
34	offense.
35	(e) A business is involved in a violation of this section if, to the
36	knowledge of an owner, manager, or other person with an ownership interest in

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1	the business, the business:
2	(1) Permits, facilitates, or allows prostitution to occur on the
3	premises or through the business's operations;
4	(2) Employs, contracts, or otherwise engages individuals for the
5	purpose of prostitution or benefits from such activities;
6	(3) Fails to take reasonable measure to prevent prostitution-
7	related activities after receiving notice of such activities; or
8	(4) Advertises, promotes, or provides a platform for the
9	facilitation of prostitution.
10	(f) In addition to any other penalty or liability authorized by law, a
11	business involved in a violation of this section shall be subject to the
12	following penalties:
13	(1) For a first violation, any business license granted under
14	the laws of the state to the business shall be suspended for thirty (30) days
15	and the business shall be issued a fine of five thousand dollars (\$5,000);
16	(2) For a second violation, any business license granted under
17	the laws of the state to the business shall be suspended for sixty (60) days
18	and the business shall be issued a fine of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000);
19	and
20	(3) For a third or subsequent violation, any business license
21	granted under the laws of the state shall be revoked and the business shall
22	pay a fine of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).
23	(g) Fine payments received under subsections (d) and (e) of this
24	section shall be deposited into the Human Trafficking Victim Support Fund.
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
