22 (b) To address needs emerging from statewide education issues and the 23 necessity of recruiting and retaining qualified personnel, the Arkansas 24 Department of Education or its successor agency is authorized for the 2024-25 2025 2025-2026 fiscal year a pool of ten (10) General Salaries positions at 26 up to a grade GS15. These positions are to be used by the Department of 27 Education in the event that the personal services needs of the Department 28 during the 2024-2025 2025-2026 fiscal year require additional positions, either by classification or in number, that are not authorized by the General 29 30 Assembly in the Regular Salaries section of this Act. These positions may 31 also be used to properly classify positions when the Department does not have 32 a vacant position available with the appropriate title and grade level.

33 (c) Any salary determinations or adjustments administered under the 34 provisions of Subsections (a) and (b) of this Section shall be made by 35 comparing the qualifications and salary levels of similar employees in school 36 districts or in other state education agencies.

1 (d) The Department of Education is authorized to access the pool 2 positions authorized in this Section at any time when it is determined by the 3 Secretary that the need exists. The Secretary shall provide a monthly report 4 of the justification for the need to allocate titles from this growth pool to 5 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and to the Arkansas Legislative Council 6 or Joint Budget Committee for review. That flexibility is 20 being accomplished by providing a position pool in Subsections (a) and (b) of 21 this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the agency broad 22 powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and appropriate 23 that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization of the 24 position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 25 Committee in the utilization of the position pool. 25 SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. 34 <u>SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the</u> 35 <u>General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits</u> 36 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the

1	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2025 is essential to the operation of
2	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
3	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
