STATE OF ARKANSAS EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT PROCLAMATION

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME - GREETINGS:

WHEREAS: An extraordinary occasion has arisen, making it necessary to convene the 89th
General Assembly into extraordinary session; and

WHEREAS: There is an immediate and pressing need to secure and appropriate additional funds to mitigate the imposition of large increases in the premiums to be charged to public-school employees who choose to participate in the Public School Employee Health Insurance Program; and

WHEREAS: There is also an immediate and pressing need to establish a continuing revenue stream that would be available to support the Public School Employee Health Insurance Program, to adopt structural reforms to the Program, and to establish a framework for a thorough study of the Public School Employee Health Insurance Program; and

WHEREAS: A small number of school districts, solely by virtue of their relatively high property assessments and low student enrollment, currently receive net revenue from the State Uniform Rate of Tax that exceeds the per-student funding amount determined by the General Assembly to be sufficient to provide an adequate education; this wealth disparity, which is unrelated to educational need and is not the result of revenue from constitutionally permissible local tax levies, creates inequity and potentially exposes the State to litigation.

NOW THEREFORE, I, MIKE BEEBE, Governor of the State of Arkansas, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article 6, Section 19 of the Arkansas Constitution, do hereby call an Extraordinary Session of the General Assembly to convene at the seat of government in the State Capitol on Thursday, October 17, 2013, at 3:00 p.m., and I do hereby specify that the General Assembly is convened in such Session to consider, and, if so advised, enact laws for the following purposes:

1. To provide for the payment of expenses and per diem of the House of Representatives and

the Senate for this Extraordinary Session.

2. To appropriate and provide for the distribution of funds for the purpose of reducing

premium increases for public-school employees who will participate in the Public School

Employee Health Insurance Program during calendar year 2014.

3. To enact legislation to redirect future savings from the General Facilities Funding and

Supplemental Millage Incentive Funding programs to the Employee Benefits Division of the

Department of Finance and Administration to be used for the exclusive benefit of public-

school employees participating in the Public School Employee Health Insurance Program.

4. To enact legislation to modify the requirements for Teacher Professional Development so as

to increase the amount of state revenue available to support the Public School Employee

Health Insurance Program.

5. To enact legislation concerning the plans offered through and the administration of the

Public School Employee Health Insurance Program, and to establish a framework for a

study of the Program that will provide recommendations for any necessary future reforms of

the system.

6. To enact legislation transferring excess revenue from the Uniform Rate of Tax to the

Educational Facilities Partnership Fund, so that it can be distributed to school districts for

the funding of qualifying educational facilities projects.

7. To confirm gubernatorial appointees.
