2024 Second Extraordinary Session

PUBLIC FINANCE

REVENUE STABILIZATION

Transfer to Arkansas Reserve Fund Set-Aside

ACT 1 (SB1) and ACT 4 (HB1001) are identical acts that require the transfer of two hundred ninety million dollars (\$290,000,000) from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund to the Arkansas Reserve Fund Set-Aside on July 2, 2024. The acts declare an emergency and are effective on and after June 19, 2024.

TAXES

INCOME TAX

Reduction of Individual and Corporate Top Rate

ACT 1 (SB1) and ACT 4 (HB1001) are identical acts that reduce the top income tax rate for individuals, trusts and estates to three and nine-tenths percent (3.9%) for tax years beginning on and after January 1, 2024, and reduce the top income tax rate for corporations to four and three-tenths percent (4.3%) for tax years beginning on and after January 1, 2024. The acts declare an emergency and are effective on and after June 19, 2024.

PROPERTY TAX

Homestead Credit - Increase and Reporting

ACT 3 (HB1002) and ACT 5 (SB3) are identical acts that increase the annual homestead property tax credit to five hundred dollars (\$500) and require the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to provide an annual report concerning whether the Property Tax Relief Trust Fund could support an increase in the amount of the homestead property tax credit. The increase in the homestead property tax credit is effective for assessment years beginning on or after January 1, 2024.

APPROPRIATION

GAME & FISH COMMISSION FOR THE 2025 FISCAL YEAR

Act 2 (SB2) of the Second Extraordinary Session of 2024 provided total authorized appropriation of \$177,698,238 for FY2025 with (644) authorized positions, including a Line Item Maximum Annual Salary of \$170,437 for the Director. The Act also includes new special language limiting the salary adjustment of the Director to 5% above the June 17, 2024 salary, any additional salary increase above the 5% must be approved by ALC or JBC.

Substantive Legislation Enacted as Authorized Through Identical Resolutions

ACT 173 (SB78) OF THE 2024 FISCAL SESSION

An Act to amend the Arkansas Data Centers Act of 2023. The act requires a digital asset mining business to apply noise-reduction techniques, including without limitation using liquid cooling or submerged cooling, fully enclosing the envelope where noise from the operation of the digital asset mining business is directly produced, or locating or relocating to a minimum of two thousand feet (2,000') from the nearest residential or commercial use structure or to an area zoned for industrial use, if the location or relocation is approved by the local government. The act requires a digital asset mining business in operation before the effective date of the act to comply with the noise reduction technique requirements no later than ninety (90) days following the effective date of the act. The act provides that a person who owns land within two thousand feet (2,000') of the nearest property line of a digital asset mining business may commence an action in circuit court to enforce the noise reduction requirements within the act. The act amends the definition of "ordinance" under the Arkansas Data Centers Act of 2023, provides that a local government shall not pass an ordinance that prohibits an individual from engaging in home digital asset mining or requires an individual to obtain approval from a local government before engaging in home digital access mining, and repeals a previous portion of the Arkansas Data Centers Act of 2023 that prohibited a local government from enacting or adopting an ordinance that limits the sound decibels generated from home digital asset mining other than the limits set for sound pollution generally or imposes a different requirement for a digital asset mining business than is applicable to a data center. The act also provides that a prohibited foreign party shall not acquire or hold by grant, purchase, devise, descent, or otherwise any interest in a digital asset mining business. The act enables the Attorney General to commence an action in circuit court if a prohibited foreign party fails to divest all interest in a digital asset mining business in accordance with the requirements of the act. The act declares an emergency and is effective on and after May 3, 2024.

ACT 175 (SB79) OF THE 2024 FISCAL SESSION

An Act that amends Arkansas law concerning digital asset mining businesses, including providing that a prohibited foreign party shall not acquire or hold by grant, purchase, devise, descent, or otherwise any interest in a digital asset mining business in this state. The act enables the Attorney General to commence an action in circuit court if a prohibited foreign party fails to divest all interest in a digital asset mining business in accordance with the requirements of the act. The act also provides that a digital asset mining business shall not operate in Arkansas without a valid permit from the Oil and Gas Commission. The act declares an emergency and is effective on and after May 3, 2024.

Substantive Legislation Enacted as Authorized Through Identical Resolutions

ACT 172 (SB77) OF THE 2024 FISCAL SESSION

An Act to amend the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. The changes to the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act include a one-time Market Adjustment (salary increase) for state employees, not to exceed 3% of their base salary. This adjustment is separate from any merit increase. Employees at maximum salary of their grade will be able to exceed maximum due to the market adjustment.

Pay grades GS01 through GS04 will be consolidated with pay grade GS05. Each of these pay grades will have the same entry and maximum salary moving forward. Employees who have a salary less than the entry of a GS05 will be moved to that entry level.

The salary maximum of all current pay grades will be increased by 10%. This change does not provide 10% salary increases to employees. It only changes the maximum salary available for each pay grade.

The rules for hazardous duty pay at the Department of Correction have been changed to allow Correctional Officers temporarily assigned maximum security units to receive hazardous duty pay while working in those units or facilities.

The act creates a special compensation award system for employees, recognizing outstanding performance in completing significant projects, job assignments, or for taking on additional duties. Each agency must have a plan approved by the General Assembly before providing any compensation award. The plan may include a payment of up to \$5,000, or additional leave time. An agency may not have access to the Performance Fund to provide these payments.

A recruiting incentive system has also been created for agencies to offer monetary and leave incentives to prospective employees. Like the special compensation awards, each agency must have a plan approved by the General Assembly before providing any type of incentive. The plan may include a payment of up to \$5,000, or leave time awarded upon hiring. An agency may not have access to the Performance Fund to provide these payments. Also, current employees are not eligible to receive a recruiting incentive, and employees receiving these incentives will be required to repay the incentive if they do not complete the established period of employment commitment.

Finally, the Department of Transformation and Shared Services must submit any amendments or revisions to the special compensation plans, the recruitment incentive plans, and the merit increase pay system to the General Assembly for approval.

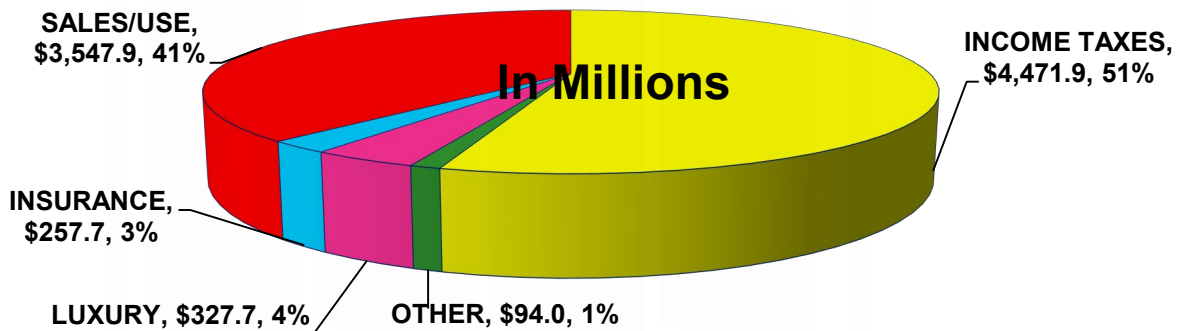

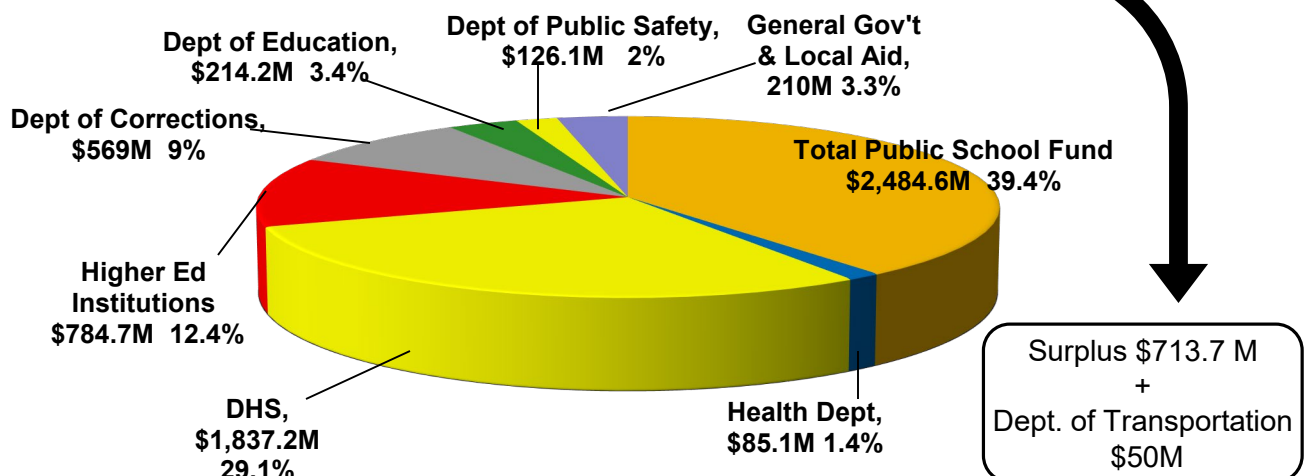

Act 171 (SB63)

- The Department has a total authorized appropriation of \$88,726,230 in FY2025 with (602) authorized positions and is funded with Special Revenues, General Revenue, Cash Funds and Federal Funds.
- Governor's Letter #11 added an additional \$167,000 in appropriation for a total appropriation of \$1,519,272 and reallocated grant assistance to local fairs for fair related expenses.
- Amendment added a new line item for the North Central District Fair with a \$0 appropriation level.

Natural Resources Commission

Act 47 (HB1009)

- The Commission has a total authorized appropriation of \$130,828,357 in FY2025 with (68) authorized positions and is funded with Special Revenues, Federal Revenue, Cash Funds and General Revenue.

Economic Development Commission

Act 123 (SB24)

- The Cabinet Department has a total authorized appropriation of \$539,965,534 in FY2025 with (133) authorized positions and is funded with Bond Proceeds, Federal Revenue, General Revenue, Cash and Trust Funds.
- Governor's Letter #4: (a) Adds 1 Chief Information Officer position, including an increase in appropriation of \$180,143 to the Shared Services Paying Account appropriation, payable from a paying account; (b) Reallocates \$100,000 from State Operations Capital Outlay to the Shared Services Paying Account; (c) Increases Professional Fees and Conference and Travel by \$100,000 each to support the realignment of operations, resources, and services within the Department to fully implement the Shared Services model across all non-regulatory divisions; (d) Reallocates \$175,000 between Operating Expenses, Conference and Travel and Industry Certificate Testing line items to support realignment within the agency with no net change in appropriation amount, and (e) Reallocates \$122,412 from Economic Infrastructure/Regionalism Grants to Extra Help and Operating Expenses line items within the State Operations appropriation to align agency appropriation with expenditure needs.

Act 82 (HB1082)

- Provides \$250,000,000 in supplemental appropriation for FY2024 payable from the Economic Development Incentive Fund for financial incentives to companies locating a new facility or expanding an existing facility with the State of Arkansas, and for companies that hire and maintain specified levels of employment, as identified in signed financial agreements with the Department of Commerce - Economic Development Commission.

Aeronautics Division

Act 103 (SB46)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$27,694,433 in FY2025 with (5) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Revenue, Special Revenue (a tax on the sale of aviation fuels and aviation related products sold in the state) and Fund Balances.
- Governor's Letter #28 increases the Conference and Travel line item within the Operations appropriation by \$6,000 to support professional development.

Development Finance Authority

Act 11 (HB1076)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$60,446,904 in FY2025 with (56) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Revenue, Cash Funds (bond proceeds and funds generated by ADFA programs) and Fund Balances.

Insurance Department

Act 122 (SB23)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$128,802,942 in FY2025 with (190) authorized positions and is funded with Fund Balances, Trust Funds (interest income,

earnings, adjustments, grants refunds, gifts), Miscellaneous Revolving Funds (employer workers' compensation benefits contributions), Federal Revenue and Special Revenue (fees, premiums collected).

- Governor's Letter #3: (a) Adds 1 Insurance Program Manager position, including an increase in appropriation of \$76,653 to the Operations appropriation, payable from trust funds; (b) Makes operating expenses within the Fraud Investigation Unit payable from the State Insurance Department Criminal Investigation Division Trust Fund since this unit is housed in the Criminal Investigation Division.

Rehabilitation Services

Act 9 (HB1027)

- Rehabilitation Services, including State Services for the Blind, has a total authorized appropriation of \$74,115,664 in FY2025 with (455) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Revenue, General Revenue, Fund Balances, Special Revenue, Cash Funds and program income from cafeteria fees, contributions, reimbursements, interest income and institutional services.

State Bank and State Securities Department

Act 56 (HB1026)

- The State Bank Department has a total authorized appropriation of \$12,551,051 in FY2025 with (78) authorized positions and is funded with Special Revenue (generated by semi-annual assessments of all financial institutions under the supervisory authority of the Division) and Fund Balances.
- The State Securities Department has a total authorized appropriation of \$4,126,147 in FY2025 with (36) authorized positions and is funded with Fund Balances, Special Revenue from filing fees, fines and Cash Funds.

Waterways Commission

Act 75 (HB1063)

- The Commission has a total authorized appropriation of \$7,335,324 in FY2025 with (3) authorized positions and is funded with Ad Valorem Taxes, Fund Balances and General Revenue.

Workforce Services Division

Act 13 (SB18)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$2,212,206,215 in FY2025 with (782) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Revenue, Educational Excellence Trust Funds, the Stabilization Tax, General Revenue, Employer Penalties and Interest, Career and Technical Education Public School Fund, Advance Interest Funds and Fund Balances.

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION

Division of Correction

Act 49 (HB1013)

- The Cabinet Department and Division of Correction have a total authorized appropriation of \$591,060,498 in FY2025 with (4,739) authorized positions and is funded from General Revenue, Special Revenue from fees, and State Central Services Funds.
- Governor's Letter #17 provided increases of \$250,000 for technology-related equipment and \$8,000,000 for overtime expenses in the Shared Services appropriation.

Act 117 (HB1086)

- Provides supplemental appropriation of \$4.2 million for FY2024 for County Jail Reimbursement and \$3 million for overtime. Also includes a fund transfer of \$4.2 million from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund to the County Jail Reimbursement Fund.

Division of Community Correction

Act 50 (HB1014)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$138,418,382 in FY2025 with (1,545) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue, Federal Revenue, Special Revenue, and Cash Funds.
- Governor's Letter #13 added \$122,160 for laundry and kitchen equipment in the Operations appropriation and \$500,000 for transitional housing in the special revenue operations appropriation.

Post-Prison Transfer Board

Act 34 (SB7)

- The Board has a total authorized appropriation of \$2,450,475 in FY2025 with (22) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue.

Sentencing Commission

Act 35 (SB8)

- The Commission has a total authorized appropriation of \$497,495 in FY2025 with (3) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue.

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Division of Elementary & Secondary Education

Act 170 (SB60)

- The Cabinet Department has a total authorized appropriation of \$2,010,462,410 in FY2025 with (399) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Revenue, Fund Balances, Cash Funds and General Revenue.
- Governor's Letter #19 increased the Educational Freedom Accounts Appropriation by \$45.3 million for a total appropriation of \$97,487,318 annually to provide for an anticipated increase in demand as eligibility is broadened under Arkansas LEARNS.

- Amendment added a new appropriation for Adult High School Grants for \$1,500,000 for grants to schools offering traditional high school training to individual exclusively over the age of 18.
- Special Language amendment adopted that amends A.C.A. 12-13-120 pertaining to the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code was revised to exempt certain Institutions of Higher Education from fully following the Fire Prevention Code if the building was previously existing before being utilized for an educational purpose.

Act 114 (SB74)

- The Supplemental Appropriation for Fiscal Year 2024 adds a total of \$4,000,000 in supplemental appropriation for the Department of Education's Medicaid Reimbursement Program Refunds/Reimbursements and is funded with Cash Funds reimbursed by the Federal Government.

Career and Technical Education Division

Act 98 (SB33)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$56,564,853 in FY2025 with (46) authorized positions and is funded with Public School Funds, Fund Balances, Federal Revenue, Educational Excellence Trust Fund and General Revenue.
- Governor's Letter #16 increased the Vocational Center Aid appropriation by \$1.4 million for a total appropriation of \$23,240,092 to allow the Division of Career and Technical Education to expense available funds for the year.

Educational Television Division (AETN)

Act 137 (HB1008)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$15,200,142 in FY2025 with (102) authorized positions and is funded with Cash Revenues, General Revenue, Federal Revenue and Fund Balances.

Higher Education Division

Act 169 (SB58)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$154,073,443 in FY2025 with (133) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue, Fund Balances, Education Excellence Trust Fund Revenues, Federal Revenue and Special Revenues.
- Governor's Letter #15 added a new appropriation for the "Sustainable Building Maintenance Program for State-Supported Institutions of Higher Education" which provides \$4,555,985 for loans to eligible institutions and is funded from General Revenue.

Martin Luther King Jr. Commission

Act 44 (HB1004)

- The Commission has a total authorized appropriation of \$444,941 in FY2025 with (4) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue and Cash Funds.

Office of Early Childhood

Act 76 (HB1068)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$318,050,715 in FY2025 with (209) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Funds and General Revenue.

- Governor's Letter #17 amended the federal appropriations, combining all federal appropriations into one large appropriation and increase the amount by \$42.3 million for a total amount of \$271,000,000. It also added a new appropriation for Childcare Facility Grants totaling \$200,000 funded from special revenues from fees and fines.

Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation Division

Act 20 (SB57)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$218,350,549 in FY2025 with (32) authorized positions and is funded with Fund Balances, General Revenue, the Education Partnership Fund and transfers from the Public School Fund.

Public School Fund (K-12 Funding)

Act 146 (HB1041)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$3,489,846,082 in FY2025 with (49) authorized positions and is funded with the Department of Education Public School Fund, Educational Adequacy Fund, Educational Excellence Trust Fund and Fund Balances.
- Governor's Letter #18 included a number of changes for the Public School Fund including:
 - Enhanced Transportation Funding is increased to \$8,000,000 to align with adequacy recommendations.
 - School Food Services is increased to \$7,650,000 to provide for the full payment of reduced price lunches for school districts statewide.
 - Special Education High Cost Occurrences is increased to \$17,498,150 to provide for anticipated expenditures.
 - A new line item is established for Transportation Modernization Grants for \$5,000,000, this line item was created by Arkansas LEARNs.
- An amendment was adopted to increase the R.I.S.E. Arkansas Appropriation by \$9.5 million for a total of \$10,470,000 and special language was added to require the total increase in the amendment to be used for the purchase of "High Quality Instructional Materials." Additionally, this amendment added special language to require ADE to report the ongoing fund balances and expenditures of the Public School Fund and the Educational Adequacy Fund to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

Act 90 (HB1094)

- The Supplemental Appropriation Act for Fiscal Year 2024 adds a total of \$29.2 million in appropriation for the Department of Education - Public School Fund. This is funded with General Revenue and includes the following line items:

Act 57 (HB1028)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$17,464,556 in FY2025 with (49) authorized positions and is funded with Public School Funds, General Revenue, Federal Revenue, Fund Balances and Other Funds.

DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENT

Division of Environmental Quality

Act 149 (HB1061)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$167,021,777 in FY2025 with (417) authorized positions and is funded with Special Revenue from various fees and penalties; Federal Revenue from grants from the Environmental Protection Agency and US Department of the Interior; and General Revenue.

Liquefied Petroleum Gas Board

Act 40 (SB49)

- The Board has a total authorized appropriation of \$629,571 in FY2025 with (6) authorized positions and is funded with Special Revenue from license, permit, and inspection fees.

Oil and Gas Commission

Act 31 (HB1066)

- The Commission has a total authorized appropriation of \$20,572,613 in FY2025 with (57) authorized positions and is funded with Special Revenue from oil and gas assessments, permit and application fees, and brine taxes.

DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Finance and Administration

Act 151 (HB1064)

- The Cabinet Department has a total authorized appropriation of \$1,438,475,140 in FY2025 with (1,841) authorized positions and is funded with State Central Services Funds, Federal Funds, Cash Funds, Fund Balances, Non-Revenue Receipts, Inter-agency Transfers, General Revenue, Tax Refunds and Special Revenues.

Assessment Coordination Division

Act 168 (SB54)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$19,606,893 in FY2025 with (33) authorized positions and is funded with fund transfers to the Real Property Reappraisal

Fund from the Public School Fund, Municipal Aid Funds, County Aid Funds, Fund Balances, Ad Valorem Taxes, General Revenue, County Assessors Continuing Education Fund and Cash Funds.

- Amendment removed special language related to used vehicle purchases as the language's expiration date was on December 31, 2023.

Child Support Enforcement

Act 77 (HB1069)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$75,102,332 in FY2025 with (775) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Funds, General Revenue and State share of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) collections.

Disbursing Officer

Act 152 (HB1065)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$12,671,397,812 in FY2025 with no authorized positions and is funded with Special Revenue, State Administration of Justice Funds, General Revenue, Federal Funds, Trust Funds, M&R proceeds and Workforce 2000 Funds.

Act 125 (SB64)

- Establishes a \$2,000,000 appropriation for FY2025, payable from the Pregnancy Help Organization Sub-Fund in the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account, for grants for Pregnancy Help Organizations.
- Special Language clarifies the funds will be transferred from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund and that the grants will come from the established Sub-Fund in Miscellaneous Agencies and that any funds not expended after June 30, 2025 will be transferred to the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund. Language also establishes the process for disbursement of the grants.

Regulatory Division

Act 70 (HB1055)

Health Department - Tobacco Prevention and Cessation

Act 4 (HB1025)

- The Health Department - Tobacco Prevention and Cessation has a total authorized appropriation of \$14,593,171 in FY2025 with (31) authorized positions and is funded with Tobacco Settlement Funds and Fund Balances.

Health Services Permit Agency

Act 5 (HB1070)

Minority Health Initiative

Act 7 (SB41)

- The Minority Health Initiative of the Targeted State Needs Program has a total authorized appropriation of \$1,791,367 in FY2025 with (6) authorized positions and is funded with Tobacco Settlement Funds and Fund Balances.

Tobacco Settlement Commission

Act 99 (SB35)

- The Commission has a total authorized appropriation of \$352,420 in FY2025 with (1) authorized positions and is funded with Tobacco Settlement Interest Earnings.

DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES

Secretary's Office

Act 153 (HB1074)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$86,393,951 in FY2025 with (670) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Funds, General Revenues, Fund Balances and Other Funds (cost allocation plan, reimbursements).
- Governor's Letter #27 deletes the sections associated with positions, appropriations, and special language that specifically reference the Placement and Residential Licensing Unit (PRLU) and the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program. It moves the PRLU positions and appropriation to the Division of Children and Family Services. The TANF program positions, appropriations, and special language are moved to the Division of County Operations, with any administrative positions and their associated appropriation moving to the Operations salaries and appropriations sections of the Secretary's Office. It also deletes the appropriation section associated with TANF's Individual Development Account program in its entirety as the account will be completely expensed in SFY2024, so it is no longer necessary. The total number of positions in the Operations appropriation increased by (17) to encompass changes made through reallocations of resources, the TANF program incorporation, and (1) pool position approved in the interim, along with (1) additional Extra Help position from the TANF program incorporation. There is also an addition of \$1.33 million to the Operations appropriation associated with those position changes.
- Amendment adds special language to provide for released restricted reserve funds, used for repairs required at the Arkansas State Hospital, to be reimbursed to the restricted reserve fund as the Department receives insurance reimbursements and requires reporting on project progress and details the frequency and components of the report.

Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services Division

Act 121 (SB17)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$313,144,793 in FY2025 with (1,157) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue, Federal Funds and Other Funds (grant funds, fees and fines, reimbursements).
- Governor's Letter #21 adds (3) positions to incorporate changes made in earlier resource reallocations. In the Operations appropriation, adds \$1.7 million for positions and the implementation of additional federal grant programs. Adds an additional \$9.5 million in the Aging and Adult Services appropriation, \$6.8 million in the Mental Health Grants appropriation and \$19 million in the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention appropriation for the implementation of additional federal grant programs.

Children and Family Services Division

Act 120 (SB16)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$314,983,101 in FY2025 with (1,443) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Funds, General Revenue and Fund Balances.
- Governor's Letter #22 adds (21) positions to incorporate changes made in earlier resource reallocations, the transfer of the Placement and Residential Licensing Unit (PRLU) from the Secretary's Office, and pool positions approved in the interim. Adds \$1.5 million in the Operations appropriation to accommodate the additional positions and maintenance and operations costs associated with the PRLU.

County Operations Division

Act 154 (HB1077)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$279,939,051 in FY2025 with (2,022) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Funds, General Revenue and Other Funds (collection, fees, reimbursements, Title XIX match).
- Governor's Letter #23 adds (188) positions from the Secretary's Office to the Regular Salaries section for the transfer and continuation of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program, along with (6) Extra Help positions. It adds an additional \$22.5 million to the Operations appropriation for the positions and operations associated with the TANF program and to allow for immediate implementation of grant programs once federal funds are received. Adds additional appropriation for federal funds of \$708,000 in the Homeless Assistance Grants line item for immediate implementation of programs once funds are received. Adds \$50.3 million to the TANF line item for the transfer of the TANF program. Adds 3.4 million to both the Community Service Block Grant and Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Programs for immediate implementation of grant programs once funds are received. Adds a new appropriation section of \$2.1 million for Emergency Rental Assistance to create a vehicle for the Division to return unused federal rental assistance funds to the federal government. Transfers two new special language sections from the Secretary's Office in order to facilitate components associated with the TANF program.

Developmental Disabilities Services Division

Act 101 (SB43)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$210,724,682 in FY2025 with (2,503) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue, Federal Funds and

Other Funds (special education funds, targeted case management and Medicaid reimbursements).

- Governor's Letter #24 adds \$3.1 million in additional appropriation to the Operations appropriation for additional costs associated with the Human Development Centers and to purchase additional specialty vehicles.

Medicaid Tobacco Settlement Program

Act 3 (HB1024)

- The Division of Medical Services portion has a total authorized appropriation of \$170,057,177 in FY2025 with (1) authorized position and is funded with Federal Funds and Tobacco Settlement Funds.
- The Division of Provider Services and Quality Assurance portion has a total authorized appropriation of \$1,285,353 in FY2025 with (19) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Funds and Tobacco Settlement Funds.

Medical Services Division

Act 161 (SB19)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$10,399,306,167 in FY2025 with (92) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Funds, General Revenues, and Other State Funding Sources (including Medicaid Trust funds, provider fees, insurance premium tax, and drug rebates).
- Governor's Letter #25 deletes (4) positions to incorporate changes made in earlier reallocations. Decreases \$420,000 in the Operations appropriations associated with the position changes. Transfers \$76.25 million in the Medicaid Grants Paying appropriation from the Hospital and Medical Services line item to the Prescription Drugs line item to shift the Part D Drug Benefits clawback so it can be expensed from the proper line item.
- Amendment adds special language that amends Arkansas Code to require the Department to complete the following: redetermine Medicaid eligibility for postpartum mothers within 8 weeks of giving birth in order to transition any postpartum mother eligible under a different category of Medicaid coverage to the new category prior to the end of the existing Medicaid eligibility category; maintain the postpartum mother in the original category only until the coverage transition is completed and verified; apply for any federal changes and develop and implement any state changes that are necessary to implement this section; and report quarterly to ALC the number of transitions completed under this section and any other data or statistics related to the implementation of this section.
- Amendment adds a section of Special Language requiring a monthly report on transfers made from the Medicaid Program Trust Fund and its subfunds to Paying Accounts to fund expenditures of the Medicaid Program and details the components of the required report.

Provider Services and Quality Assurance Division

Act 6 (HB1075)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$20,278,539 in FY2025 with (194) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue and Federal Funds.

Youth Services Division

Act 124 (SB45)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$83,345,290 in FY2025 with (122) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue, Federal Funds and Other Funds (serious offender funds, rehab funds, targeted case management).
- Governor's Letter # 26 deletes (2) positions and \$205,000 in appropriation to incorporate changes from earlier resource reallocations.

DEPARTMENT OF INSPECTOR GENERAL

Act 165 (SB47)

- The Cabinet Department has a total authorized appropriation of \$13,657,399 in FY2025 with (69) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Funds, General Revenue, State Central Services and Cash Funds.
- Governor's Letter # 12 reallocates one (1) position and associated Operating Expenses costs between the Shared Services and Independent Tax Appeals Commission. It also reallocates \$70,000 between line items within the Office of Internal Audit - Operations appropriation.
- Amendment adds special language that amends Arkansas Code to limit the Department of Finance and Administration's ability to seek judicial relief of a decision made by the Independent Tax Appeals Commission regarding sales and use taxes.

DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND LICENSING

Labor Division

Act 10 (HB1071)

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$9,374,478 in FY2025 with (95) authorized positions and is funded with Cash Funds, General Revenue, Fund Balances, Special Revenue and Inter-Agency Transfers.

Boards and Commissions

Act 147 (HB1045)

- The Boards and Commissions have a total authorized appropriation of \$13,650,569 in FY2025 with (93) authorized positions and is funded with Cash Funds and Special Revenues.
- Governor's Letter #10 adds special language amending Arkansas Code 19-5-1271 to allow the Motor Vehicle Commission to retain a running average of 3 years of operating expenses before funding the Automotive Technologist Grants.

- The Division has a total authorized appropriation of \$22,823,641 in FY2025 with (161) authorized positions and is funded with Federal Funds, General Revenue and Special Revenue from forfeitures of funds and properties and mandatory DNA sample fees.
- Governor's Letter #20 added 2 new Associate Medical Examiner positions.

Law Enforcement Standards & Training Commission

Act 138 (HB1012)

- The Commission has a total authorized appropriation of \$5,292,065 in FY2025 with (48) authorized positions and is funded with General Revenue and Fees from the Public Safety Trust Fund and Law Enforcement Family Relief Trust Fund, special license fees and booking administration fees, and Cash Funds.
- Governor's Letter #20 added 2 new Public Safety Security Officer positions.

State Police Division

Act 138 (HB1012)

Emergency Management Division

- Agency letter amendment included the following: a) Increased Line Item Maximum Annual Salary Rate for all employees by 10%. b) Decreased authorized positions by 4. c) Decrease in overall appropriation by \$40,375.

LEGISLATIVE AUDIT

PROSECUTOR COORDINATOR'S OFFICE

Act 118 (SB9)
